The rebels, estimated to number about 30, are still at large in the mountainous region about 15 miles northeast of Saltrou, where they landed. The rebels are being pursued, but government forces have been unable to engage them in battle. The inability of the Haitian Army and militia to maintain contact with the rebel group, or even determine its exact size, is an increasing psychological advantage to the rebels.

Inhabitants of two villages in the area of operations have given aid to the rebels. The government consequently has already burned one village and another is to be razed as an example to the inhabitants of the area.
