## AGENT/PROJECT REVIEW SPECIAL CONNECTION CAULST

I. CAMENT is a president SPD personality and editor of the Berlin Telegraf.

He was several years and on actual agent status but is today from the KWTHE viewpoint only an informal contact, furnishing advice, political information and a special news gathering service. This news services arises from the "Out Buero" of the Telegraf which solicits letters to the editor, free-lance reports and, in fact, writings on any and all subjects from the East lone readers. For usable articles, the newspaper frequently pays well; for the resaining material, it provides a filing and library area. This information is for the most part of no value as intelligence but does at times produce items of interest to us. The editor of the "Out Buero" is a source sometimes used by ZIFPER, sometimes by ourselves and of interest to CIC. The presence of this wan appears to be a threatening circumstance to the various services but C. I and BUB believe that they have control of the situation and the editor, referred to as CAMENT-2, is not a danger. "perstional, C. I has requested Washington to prepare a travelling companion, itinarray and financial assistance for CAMENT on his coming trip to the United States in the interest of continuing to increase his pro-U.S. Nestern outlook.
