There are no WOMACE or WOHITE traces on Willem SASSEN van ELSLOO. FYI: CENTREG files indicate that one Wilhelm Antonius Maria SASSEN, aka Willy DE FONTEIJN, aka fnu BRUIN, aka fnu SKORPION, born 16 April 1918 in Geertruidenberg, was the Subject of an interrogation in August 1945 at which time he furnished information about the propaganda organization of the Schutzstaffel (Nazi Black Guards - SS), the development of the Skopion (sic) Action and Aktif Propaganda, and a list of individuals connected with these organizations. SASSEN was a member of the Waffen SS, and in 1944, became a member of the Skorpion West, a section of SS Standarte Kurt Eggers which was the propaganda organ of most importance at that time. He attained the status of SS Oberscharfuhrer. After his interrogation, it was recommended that he be transferred to SS Camp Otterloo. In February 1946 the Netherlands Security Service requested any information pertaining to SASSEN's whereabouts, and further, instructed that he be arrested if located and turned over to them. CENTREG files show that he was last known to be in the custody of the British. Available records disclose no further information. This information is dated 14 October 1960; it is a trace reply to the AMCONGEN Stuttgart. We find no connection between SASSEN van ELSLOO and Frederico SCHWEND other than that noted in paragraph 4 of Reference.</p> <p>2. FYI: The most recent information on SCHWEND is correspondence originating with CALLIKAK, but provided to RVROCK by LNERGO concerning a letter written by SCHWEND to Julius MADER. Pertinent to this exchange are other letters written to MADER, dated 1969, which may be the reason for CATUSEK's renewed interest in SCHWEND's activities. The 1969 letters are discussed in EGMA-22333, 20 June 1969, et al. We believe that there may be a connection between the letter written by SCHWEND in 1966 and those recently acquired, written in 1969, and will discuss this possible</p>
