The plans outlined in Reference A, to use CAHELM as a penetration of the SPD, did not materialize because CAHELM could not bring himself to give up his rapport with the wide range of political factions with which he currently associates, nor the discipline of a political party. Therefore [ ] turned him over to [ ] on 1 April 1966, to explore more thoroughly his LCHARVEST potential. Summarized briefly, CAHELM has good access within the Deutsche China Gesellschaft (DCG), which however has been inactive for several years because of the political unpopularity of Wolf SCHENKE. CAHELM has only limited access in the Ostasiatischer Verein (OAV) because lacking any China background he is not invited to many of the select gatherings of the OAV at which China travellers and China traders meet and exchange views. He is hoping to rectify this situation, however, by arranging for himself a trip to China under DCG auspices, preferably in the summer of 1967 when his sons are planning to go abroad. Aside from the services that CAHELM as a fully recruited legal traveller could perform, the trip would give him an increased stature in circles interested in China, and while preparing for the trip he would have cover to contact almost anyone in Hamburg associated with China and to seek out names of other legal travellers, etc., which he at present can do only to a limited extent for cover reasons. Aside from his LCHARVEST potential, CAHELM continues to maintain his membership in a large number of fringe political movements.
