SPECIFIC Foreign Ministry Advisors

1. We desire to call your attention to the following rather interesting article which appeared in the Tokyo Shimbun of 28 December 1954:

"There are two Foreign Ministers. They are SHIGEMITSU Mamoru and TANI Naoto. TANI is an advisor to the Foreign Ministry. An advisor is one who observes and, when he is asked, reports his opinion; he is not a responsible executive. But this advisor is the reverse; he is given the status of Ambassador and reviews all diplomatic documents; he meets with foreign representatives as a Minister; and of course he interferes in personnel matters. The Minister is the open, being Vice President of the Democratic Party and Deputy Premier of the HARADA Cabinet, is busy. If there is an election, he will be absent from his office, running around. Have they set up a behind-the-scenes Minister in preparation for this? The minor officials are gossiping that soon SHIGEMITSU will float away and TANI will get the real power in the Foreign Ministry.

"There are two ministers but there are three Vice Ministers. Besides OKUMURA, who holds the actual job, OTI Saburo and KASE Yoshikazu have come along as Counsellors (Sensyu) and are said to be glaring around the Ministry as the Vice Ministers under Minister TANI. No wonder the minor officials are going over. The reason is that in the ICHIKAWA Cabinet era, Foreign Minister OKAZAKI Katsuo was really the Vice Minister.

"In the 'Y Purges', guys IOSHIDA didn't like were kicked out, and in the 'G Purges', SHIBASU Jiro's forces strongly influenced the Ministry, but there were no 'O Purges'; OKAZAKI merely carried the orders.

It is indisputable that those who hoped most strongly for the resignation of the KOSHIDA Cabinet were the rank-and-file officials of the Foreign Ministry. But they have gone from the frying pan into the fire. "Mr. Shigenobu is all right, but his associates (Tsukinono)<sup>1</sup> are bad," they say.

"SHIGENOBU, unlike YOSHIDA or OKAZAKI, is a real Foreign Ministry man, and so there appears to be a good-sized SHIGENOBU faction remaining in the Ministry. They felt that the old boss was back but that the Vice Ministers attached to him were an evil. They are forgetting one thing: SHIGENOBU's ability to stand alone is not just because of the length of his legs; it is because his brains are getting lame."

1. This is a pun; "tsukinono" can mean either "associate" or "devil".
2. SHIGENOBU lost a leg in Shanghai in 1932 when a bomb was thrown at a group of Japanese officials.
