1. The following goods were transported in three shipments (November 1952, December 1952, and February 1953) on one of the river tug-boats of the Czechoslovak Elbe and Oder Navigation Corporation (CSPLO) from the Loubi (N51/ F 56) harbor to Hamburg:

a. November 1952:

2. The following goods were transported in two shipments (November 1952 and January 1953) on one of the river tugboats of CSPLC from Hamburg to the Decin (N51/ F 56) harbor in Czechoslovakia:

a. November 1952:

310,033 kilograms of India rubber in 2,798 bundles
 50,902 kilograms of cotton waste in 190 bundles
 36,059 kilograms of fish acid (Fischsäure) in 177 crates

b. January 1953:

297,034 kilograms of India rubber in 2,727 bundles

All these goods were sent to Czechoslovakia by the Eberhardt Clemens firm in Hamburg. India rubber has its origin in Indonesia. It was reloaded in the Hamburg Harbor from the following ships of unknown nationalities: Brente Garoet, Weltvrede, Uranienborg, Baumhor, Tarakan, Baulomond, Nordaval, Lelandia, India, and Aagtekerk.
