Proposed Trip to Japan by Mr. John Jay HOPKINS and Mr. William S. HALSTRAD

I. Beekermund:

- A. The () Mission has recently been in touch with a well known and influential Japanese newspaper and radio executive. This individual is desirous of engaging in a fully extended campaign promoting President Risenhouser's Atoms for Peace preparal.
- B. This individual points out that the speech of Mr. John Jay HOPKIRS, President of General Dynamics, Emo., before the Mational Association of Manufacturers on 1 December 1954 has had considerable impact among leading Japanese industrialists. In this speech, HOPKIRS urged installation of Atomic power plants in under-developed areas with particular reference to Japan and the Far East. HOPKIRS termed the proposal as an Atomic "Marshall Fian".
- C. On behalf of HOPKIRS, Mr. William S. HALSTRAD, Precident of UNITEL Corporation of New York City, H.Y., has been in touch with the Japanese principal exploring the possibility of having HOPKIRS and HALSTRAD make a trip to Japan to explain his "Marshell Flam" preposal to the Japanese.

II. Conclusions:

- A. The Par East Division requests that your office determine:
- 1. If HOPKIES and HALSTEAD are planning a trip to Japan and if so, when, and the financial evrangements that are being made to cover the costs of much a trip.
 - 2. The complete it inserery of the trip.
- 3. The individuals (Japanese and Cocidental) in Japan that HOPKIRS and HALSTEAD may be dealing with concerning the proposed trip.
- 4. If HOPKIES and HALSTEAD are not going to make the trip, the details and reasons who they are not going.
- B. In carrying out the obove assignment, the Far East Division requests that no governmental interest be shown, and in particular that no CIA interest be shown.
- G. We are ferrarding as Attachmento 1 and 2 fer your information and use brief biographical sketches on NORGIES and HALSTEAD.
