SUBJECT SPECIFIC Psych/Operational Support of Japanese ODAKLE Dept. of Energy

ACTION REQUIRED: Inform PODAM of Contents of Para 1.

1. This is to inform you that in accordance with a suggestion made by [] when he was in Washington, ODACID and ODAKLE would support a request by PODAM for two ODAKLE organization experts to visit Japan on TDI to brief the Japanese on ODAKLE management and organization problems and methods. They are also prepared to extend all courtesies to PODAM, should he decide to visit the United States in connection with this matter, including arrangements for him to meet IDEN A.

2. The possibility of sending IDEN B on a good-will mission to Japan has already been considered by ODAKLE and [] is said to be enthusiastic about the possibility, although no formal action has been taken.

3. In order that it will not appear that the U.S. Government is attempting to foist its help on the Japanese, the initiative for ODAKLE specialists to visit Japan and for PODAM to come to the States must be taken by Japan. It is suggested that PODAM write to IDEN A at the address indicated, and state his interest in visiting the United States (at his own expense) to discuss his plans for Japan's ODAKLE, and/or in having the specialists go to Japan for the purpose outlined above.

4. When IDEN A receives the letter, an invitation for an unofficial visit will be forthcoming. Neither ODACID nor ODAKLE is in a position to finance PODAM's trip. If you feel it is necessary for KUBARK to contribute to his expenses, this can be done. However, we would favor a minimum sum. At any event we can arrange for the requisite dollar exchange. Travel expenses of the management specialists would be borne by ODAKLE.

5. Prior to taking any action we suggest that you discuss this matter with Tokyo ODACID. We also request that you keep us informed of developments, in order that we may follow up at this end and be certain that plans materialize as you desire.

6. We understand that FODAM is also interested in the problem of getting scientists to work smoothly with his managers. We suggest that you tell FODAM that if he wishes a scientist with practical knowledge of this problem to visit Japan, we can try to get one to go but cannot guarantee success.

7. Should FODAM come to this country, we would like you to consider our having a KUBARK Headquarters representative meet with him for a frank discussion of the ramifications of our current relationship, exactly what FODAM expects from our association, and an evaluation of what KUBARK stands to gain through the development of this affiliation. An agenda of the topics you feel should be considered would be of enormous help.
