1. In the January 28th issue of CNT (printed in Perouse) there appeared a brief news item to the effect that Otto SKOZERNY, living in Madrid under an assumed name, had been the victim of a robbery. It was reported that the apartment which SKOZERNY occupied in Madrid with his wife had been broken into by mysterious vandals and that it was unknown whether there were political motives for the robbery.

2. On the basis of the above, it is requested that you obtain through any further information you may be able to provide on the matter.

3. In reply to your query in paragraph 2 of NSA-1354, it has been ascertained that neither the United States Government nor any of the Allied governments have any claim on Subject from a legal viewpoint. Subject was being held for trial by the Germans when he escaped detention in 1947. As you have gathered from recent reports, however, there is a continuing interest in Subject on the part of Headquarters.
