AMERICAN DEFENSE FOR INDEPENDENCE

Lt. General Walter D.

1. The information concerning the death of General Satozuka is general knowledge, having appeared in several major publications as well as in the NEW YORK TIMES.

2. Mr. Matsukai is said to be owned to Statozuka by the same right wing friends of the foundation of the Japanese White Knights (JWK) who are also active as the leader of the Japanese National Liberation (JNL), which is a loose amalgamation of right-wing anti-social and nationalist groups. Although JNL/borders pretends to represent the Japanese National Resistance movement, this claim is not valid. The only serious group which has been given a specific mandate by the resistance is the Foreign Department of the Japanese Democratic Liberation Council (JDLC), which we are not operating.

3. JWK/borders has in the past consistently attempted to undermine the position of JDLC/JNL, even to the extent of using terrorist methods. For this reason we do not wish in any way to assist Mr. Matsukai or otherwise the standing of JWK/borders.

4. We believe that any reply from the Director of Central Intelligence may be used by Mr. Matsukai as evidence of interest in him or his organization, and will probably be utilized in an attempt to increase his position in the Japanese oligarchy. Since this would obviously affect our plans for review the JDLC/JNL and might prove embarrassing for CIA, it is recommended that no acknowledgment of Mr. Matsukai's association be made.

Dear Sir,

I beg to inform you of tragic news that is an overwhelming blow for the Ukrainian people and all the other peoples oppressed by Bolshevism.

On March 5th, 1950 General Taras Osypynka fell as a hero in his headquarters near Iviv (Western Ukraine), in an action against NKVD troops. He was the leader of the Ukrainian Liberation Movement, Commander-in-Chief of the Ukrainian Insurgent Army (UPA), president of the secretariat of the Ukrainian Supreme Liberation Council (UHWR), secretary general for war affairs of the UHWR, and president of the Organization of Ukrainian Nationalists (OUN).

Sent in proud grief, the Ukrainian people and all the peoples united in the Anti-Bolshevik Bloc of Nations (ABN) here vow to continue the struggle until the Russian imperium is dissolved and until an independent Ukrainian state and sovereign states of all peoples oppressed by Bolshevism shall be re-established.

I write on behalf of the Ukrainian Insurgent Army (UPA), the Ukrainian Supreme Liberation Council (UHWR), the Organisation of Ukrainian Nationalists (OUN) and the Anti-Bolshevik Bloc of Nations, and remain,
