IN SPITE OF EVERYTHING AND REGARDLESS OF EXPERIENCE, LOGIC, AND SCIENCE, PEOPLE ARE STILL RELYING ON THE STATE'S CRUTCHES TO GET OUT OF THE CRISIS. THEY DEMAND THAT STATE POWERS BE EXTENDED, AND PRACTICALLY EVERYONE IS ASKING FOR SOMETHING: BENEFITS, SUBSIDIES, LOW PRICES, TAX EXEMPTIONS, FREE ZONE STATUS, PROTECTION FROM IMPORTS...

LANDOWNERS, WHO PERCEIVE A THREAT TO THE COUNTRY'S ECONOMIC SECURITY IN IMPORTED FOODSTUFFS, ARE ASKING FOR MONEY AND PROTECTION FROM IMPORTS. A. LEBED SHARES THE ALARM OF GENERALS IN THE KOLKHOZ-SOVKHOZ SYSTEM AND IS PREPARED TO DEFEND THE COUNTRY FROM AN INVASION OF FOREIGN YOGURT.

ON BEHALF OF THE ASSOCIATION OF ST. PETERSBURG INDUSTRIAL ENTERPRISES (36 ENTERPRISES AND ORGANIZATIONS), V. ZANIN ASKS THAT PRICES FOR ENERGY RESOURCES NOT BE ALLOWED TO RISE AND THAT PRODUCERS AND EMPLOYEES IN ALL TYPES OF ACTIVITY--FROM INDUSTRY TO THE FINANCIAL SPHERE--BE SUPPORTED WITH THE STRICTEST QUOTAS ON THE IMPORTATION OF FINISHED PRODUCTS: "THE IMPORTATION OF FINISHED PRODUCTS SHOULD BE DRASTICALLY SUSPENDED--WE NEED BREATHING SPACE." "BUDGET MONEY SHOULD NOT BE SPENT ON FOREIGN ITEMS WHICH BEAR FOREIGN WORDS AND FOREIGN LETTERS."

IT NEVER OCCURS TO PEOPLE THAT WHAT THE STATE COULD DO BETTER IS TO ESTABLISH RULES FOR ENTREPRENEURIAL ACTIVITY THAT ARE IDENTICAL FOR EVERYONE AND TO ENSURE THEIR STRICT IMPLEMENTATION. THEY DO NOT UNDERSTAND THAT STOPPING IMPORTS WILL LEAD VERY QUICKLY TO A FOOD SHORTAGE, IT WILL PARALYZE PRODUCTION WHICH FUNCTIONS WITH IMPORTED RAW MATERIAL, AND IT WILL STOP THE TECHNICAL REEQUIPMENT OF INDUSTRY.

NOT PERMITTING PRICES TO RISE MEANS FREEZING THEM. STABLE PRICES ALWAYS GIVE RISE TO BLACK MARKETS, SPECULATION, SHORTAGE, LINES, THEFT, PRIVILEGED CONSUMPTION, AND BRIBES EVERYWHERE... THE VICIES OF AN ECONOMY WITH STABLE PRICES CAN BE ENUMERATED AD INFINITUM. AN ENTIRE LIBRARY OF BOOKS HAS BEEN WRITTEN ON THIS SUBJECT.

IN SUMMING UP, LET US NOTE THAT A MAJORITY SPOKE ABOUT A STRATEGY OF TURNING BACKWARD (THE ACADEMICIANS), AT BEST, A STRATEGY OF RETAINING AUTHORITY (THE GOVERNMENT) AND A STRATEGY OF SURVIVAL (THE BANKERS AND INDUSTRIALISTS).

NO ONE SAID A WORD ABOUT THE STRATEGY OF DEVELOPMENT. BUT AFTER ALL, ONLY THIS STRATEGY, BASED NOT ON PROTECTION FROM THE EXPANSION OF WESTERN GOODS AND NOT ON SUBSIDIES FOR RURAL AND URBAN COMMODITY PRODUCERS, BUT ON SOLUTION OF THE PROBLEM OF OWNERSHIP AND GRANTING EVERYONE THE NECESSARY ECONOMIC RIGHTS AND FREEDOMS, CAN DIRECT US TO A PATH WHICH LEADS TO PROSPERITY.

NO ONE CONSIDERED THE PROBLEM OF SALES IN RUSSIAN INDUSTRY. HOWEVER, THIS IS THE VERY PROBLEM WHICH DEFINES THE NATURE OF THE PROBLEMS FACING SOCIETY. MANY OBLASTS CANNOT SELL THEIR BUCKWHEAT, BUTTER, MEAT, OR MILK... AND ENTERPRISES CANNOT SELL THEIR MACHINE TOOLS AND MACHINERY. THE DIAGNOSIS IS OVERSTOCKING, AND THE NAME OF THE ILLNESS IS NONCOMPETITIVENESS RESULTING FROM HIGH COSTS, LOW QUALITY, AND A TOTAL LACK OF INCENTIVES TO PRODUCE QUALITY ITEMS CHEAPLY.

TWICE DURING THE PERIOD OF REFORMS, RUSSIA'S ACADEMICIANS HAVE REJECTED A LIBERAL PATH, AND FOR MUTUALLY EXCLUSIVE REASONS. FROM 1985 TO 1991 BECAUSE OF IMMaturity AND UNREADINESS FOR RADICAL CHANGES, AND IN 1996 BECAUSE OF "THE CATASTROPHIC ECONOMIC SITUATION." THEN AS NOW, ALL THEIR HOPES ARE PLACED WITH THE STATE. AT THAT TIME, IT WAS GIVEN WIDE POWERS TO IMPLEMENT A SLOW AND GRADUAL REFORM, AS A RESULT OF WHICH PRIVATIZATION WAS TO BEGIN IN 2005. NOW EVEN BROADER POWERS ARE BEING GIVEN TO INTRODUCE EXTRAORDINARY MEASURES, AND WHAT IS MORE, IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE 1996-2005 PROGRAM. APPARENTLY 2005 POSSESSES SOME KIND OF MAGIC APPEAL.

THE CREATIVE UNION RUNS FIRST AND FOREMOST UNDER THE BANNERS OF PROTECTING CULTURE AND DEFENDS THE INTERESTS OF PEOPLE WHO WORK IN THIS SPHERE. THE ASSOCIATION SEES AS ONE OF ITS MAIN TASKS PRESERVATION OF THE CITY'S SYSTEM OF CULTURAL ESTABLISHMENTS-- LIBRARIES, HOUSES AND PALACES OF CULTURE, CINEMA THEATERS, ETC. MOST NAMES ON THE REGISTERED LIST OF 11 CANDIDATES ARE HEADS AND FUNCTIONARIES OF VARIOUS CULTURAL, EDUCATIONAL, AND SCIENCE ESTABLISHMENTS, WHO ARE NOT TOO WELL KNOWN TO CITY RESIDENTS. THE MOST COLORFUL FIGURE ON THE LIST IS ALEKSANDR ILYIN, IN THE PAST A CIRCUS PERFORMER AND NOW A WELL-KNOWN FOLK-MEDICINE HEALER. ALSO NOMINATED TOGETHER WITH THE CREATIVE UNION IS ALEKSEY KOVALEV, FORMER DEPUTY OF THE LATEST CITY SOVIET, WHO ACQUIRED SOME FAME AT THE END OF THE 1980'S THROUGH HIS ACTIONS IN PROTECTING ARCHITECTURAL LANDMARKS, AND THEN ACTIVELY FOUGHT THE MAYORALTY'S COMPREHENSIVE CITY PLANNING PROJECTS.

IN THE SAME LIST ARE FILM DIRECTOR V. BORTKO AND V. ORLOV, CHAIRMAN OF THE PRESIDUM OF THE FOUNDATION FOR AIDING RESIDENTS OF BLOCKADED LENINGRAD. (A TOTAL OF 11 CANDIDATES.) "BUSINESS PETERSBURG" LEADERS POINT OUT THAT THE BLOC UNITES PEOPLE WHO DO NOT NEED TO BE TAUGHT—THEY HAVE A GOOD IDEA OF THE MECHANISM FOR SOLVING CITY AND SECTORAL PROBLEMS.

"BUSINESS PETERSBURG" INTENDS TO BRING UP A SCORE OF DRAFT LAWS AT THE VERY FIRST SESSION OF THE CITY ASSEMBLY. THE GOAL IS TO MAKE IT PROFITABLE FOR GOODS PRODUCERS TO PRESERVE AND CREATE JOBS; SUPPORT THE POPULATION'S INVESTMENT IN RESIDENTIAL HOUSING CONSTRUCTION; INCREASE THE ROLE OF LOCAL TAXATION; AND BRING THE CITY'S CREDIT AND FINANCE SYSTEM IN LINE WITH THE INTERESTS OF THE POPULATION. THE BLOC ALSO INTENDS TO PROPOSE A PROGRAM FOR SETTING UP ENTERPRISES FOR THE PRODUCTION AND SALE OF GOODS INTENDED FOR LOW-INCOME POPULATION GROUPS.

THE CONSTITUTIONAL DEMOCRAT UNION OF ST. PETERSBURG ((SUBHEAD)) REGISTERED IN DECEMBER 1992. ITS RANKS ARE RELATIVELY SMALL—ABOUT 100 MEMBERS. THEY ARE MAINLY RESEARCH ASSOCIATES OF ACADEMIC AND OTHER INSTITUTIONS. ACCORDING TO THE UNION'S LEADERS, THEY TRY TO ACCEPT INTO THEIR ORGANIZATION ONLY THOSE THEY TRUST COMPLETELY. NEITHER DO CADETS ((CONSTITUTIONAL DEMOCRATS)) APPROVE OF CHASING FAMOUS NAMES. IN ADDITION TO THEIR PARTY LEADER ALEKSANDR KOZYREV, THE UNION NOMINATED MARITIME TECHNICAL UNIVERSITY PROFESSOR ALEKSANDR FEDOROV, AGROBUSINESS ACADEMY INSTRUCTOR BORIS GAVRILOV, SEMEN VAYKHANSKIY, A LEADING RESEARCH ASSOCIATE OF THE TSNII ((CENTRAL SCIENTIFIC-RESEARCH INSTITUTE)) OF FUEL APPARATUSES; AND OTHER MEMBERS OF THE SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY INTELLIGENTSIA.

THE UNION SUPPORTS THE SOONEST POSSIBLE IMPLEMENTATION OF REFORMS, REORGANIZATION OF THE JUDICIARY AND LAW ENFORCEMENT ORGANS, AND DEVELOPMENT OF SELF-RULE. CADETS SEE THE MAIN TASK OF THE STATE AS ENSURING THE RIGHTS AND FREEDOMS OF CITIZENS—EVERYTHING ELSE THE CITIZENS WILL DO FOR THEMSELVES. OVERALL, THEY CONSIDER THEMSELVES SUCCESSORS TO THE CAUSE BEGUN BEFORE THE OCTOBER REVOLUTION—THE CAUSE OF BUILDING A LAW-BASED STATE.

IN THE EVENT ALL THE CANDIDATES FROM THE CONSTITUTIONAL DEMOCRATS UNIONS ARE ELECTED TO THE CITY ASSEMBLY, THEY WILL VOTE FOR CHANGING THE EXISTING STATUTE ON THE STRUCTURE OF ORGANS OF POWER IN ST.
