<p>1. Our attention was recently called to an old file on IDENTITY-1 who is interesting largely because of a signed statement she wrote some months before her departure in March 1954 from Salzburg for Munich.</p> <p>2. IDENTITY-1 worked from mid-'48 until late 1953 as secretary and office manager to GROSSBAHN, a principal agent in an operation originally run by ZIPPER and taken over by us sometime after 1950. GROSSBAHN ran across-the-board operations from Salzburg against satellite countries bordering on Austria. The project was terminated when GROSSBAHN emigrated to PBPRIME where he now lives. (Further KUBARK contact with him is undesirable, so he cannot be used as a channel to locate Subject.)</p> <p>3. After GROSSBAHN's departure from Austria, Subject announced her intention to return to Germany and seek employment with either CARVER or CAVATA. She wrote the letter mentioned in Paragraph 1 which is forwarded to German Station addressees as Attachment B, and she left a Munich address (IDENTITY-2) which her Salzburg case officer forwarded in Reference. There is no indication here that contact with Subject in Germany was established; we are trying to check this out with the case officer who handled the GROSSBAHN operation, but his present location may make this difficult.</p> <p>4. We have run extensive traces on Subject, but are unable to find any reference to her after her departure from Salzburg. The <u>Genealogisches Handbuch</u> was also checked without result. The Munich phone directory for 1957/1958 lists IDENTITY-3 who is undoubtedly related.</p>

Time may have altered the sentiments expressed in her letter, but if she occupies a position we could usefully exploit, we believe you may want to consider an approach. If this suggestion has merit, we suggest full field traces. In the meantime, we ask that COS check its records for any reference to a contact with Subject in Germany. We would also appreciate any information later than 1953 which MLB files contain, in view of Subject's former connection with ZIPPER. Traces are not solicited from other addressees unless Subject is known to Vienna or Bonn Station personnel.

6. Attached herewith for FOB and COS, Germany is a copy of FRQ Part II prepared in October 1952. Under separate cover, we are sending a summary of biographic data.

Since I am dealing with so far completely unknown factors regarding my future official employment, I consider it fair to make the following suggestions:

No ties should exist between the Organization that I have served so far and myself until such time when security and fertility of my future work allow a reestablishment. The reasons are:

- a. I will endeavor to obtain as important a position as possible either in the German Foreign Service or with the Amt fuer Verhassungsschutz. I myself prefer the Foreign Service.
- b. Whether and when this is possible cannot be predicted.
- c. Even when this target should be reached, it is probable that I will be under German surveillance for some time. If found out, my work for the United States could cause embarrassment.

I therefore feel that I should propose a separation for the time being. I would suggest that I be given an address which I could contact when conditions develop the way I hope they will. I finally want to confirm my unswerving faith in the United States and my willingness to work for the U. S. Government at any time.

<p>Family Background:</p>	<p>Father Freiherr Eberhard von der TANN-RATHSAMHAUSEN, deceased 1943. Mother Marietta von der TANN-RATHSAMHAUSEN, nee von STETTEN; died in Salzburg in January 1950. Brother Krafft von der TANN-RATHSAMHAUSEN</p>	
<p>Education:</p>	<p>1922-1926 primary school. 1926-1934 high school for girls in Munich. Was taken out of school "for political reasons (not further explained) one year before graduation. 1934-1936 travelled extensively, polishing up her knowledge of English, French, and Italian. 1936 took up the study of the Japanese language in Munich; continued her studies until 1939, at which time she graduated from the Oriental Seminary of the University Berlin.</p>	
<p>Employment:</p>	<p>Right after the outbreak of the war, subject was ordered to report for duty to the German High Command, where she worked as a censor for Japanese commercial mail until summer 1940. She then transferred to the German Foreign Office, section Sonderdienst Seehaus (Monitoring service), where she held a leading position (unspecified) until the end of the war.</p>	
<p>General information:</p>	<p>At the end of April 1945, subject rejoined her family, which had moved to Salzburg in 1938. At the time the Germans had to leave Austria, i.e., at the end of 1945, subject moved to PRIEN/Chiemsee, and later on to MUNICH, but returned to SALZBURG in March 1948. She held no position between April 1945 and March 1948.</p>

41. Loyalty to GROSSBAHN and to the U.S. seems the predominant control.		
42. She believes she is working for an American agency, but does not know which one specifically.

45. Subject acts as secretary and office manager for GROSSBAHN.
