Former Japanese intelligence officer with extensive connections in TATSUII and HATTORI groups.

- TATSUI Eiichi at the beginning of April 1952 was devoting his arimary attention to planning an overall basic reorganisation of the Japanese armed forces. Since he is an intelligence officer and not a specialist on organization, he depends heavily upon three assistants:
- a. HO30DA Akira (如田田), an infaintry colonel, who was a member of the Organization Section of JICS and is an expert on organization and mobilisation.
- (古山 b. XTAKAYA! A Hobutake (古山 信 武 TAKAYAMA Nobutake (高山 信山), an antillery/colonel, formerly a member of the Anti-Airraid and Fortification Section of JIGS.
  - c. XIIIIANO Tadatoshi (insatoshi) (智野正年), major general, an expert on training and education, who served in the Training and Education Superintendent's Office and was an exchange officer with a Soviet infantry regiment in the USSR.
  - 2. The YOSHIDA government has instructed TATSUHI to have nothing to do with the MATTORI Organisation. General BHTD URA Sadamu (下 对 注), who was a member of TATSUH's organization, was expelled from it for his nersistent failure to obey the government order and sever connections with HAFFORI. TATSUI complies with the order and follows the government MPR policy of roarmement, which the HAFFORI group openly or oses. 2 His strict adherence to instructions has caused strong criticism from IWAKUR Goya (岩野 本 加 ) and WATAHABE 渡)。 liataru (渡 辽
  - J. The government attitude toward the MATRORI group has become increasingly antagonistic, and the group has lost influence rapidly since the denarture from Japan of General Willoughby. Some of the group numbers are beginning to waver in their allegiance, as they fear to be ignored in the rearmement program. The group is suffering especially since its operational funds have been completely out off. 4 Within the faction there was some disagreement between HATICRI and his superior in the

Demobilisation Bureau, MITAMA Yogo ( ) A \* (), over use of Japaness government "wer termination appropriations" to finance the HATTORI Organisation throughout Japan, and HATTORI was not given any funds from this source.
