RI File (WFPA-23P) is an official dispatch from to FBW concerning Hungarians in Amstria, dated 9 October 1947. Source of the information is This report indicates that the French authorities very strongly support Hungarians in their zone, first of all rightist elements, and Count Bela TELEKI appears to have a first-class standing with French authorities. He appears to be troubled about the poor Hungarians and problems of the DP's. In the former regimes, TELEKI was very strongly on the Right. He stood up for collaboration with Germany and Hungary, thus taking an active part in the War.

RI File #6-8-1-24 (USFA-SE-R-73) is an extract from USFA Special Biweekly Report #73, dated 3 September 1948. It listed the officers of the exiled Hungarian Government, and Count Bela THLEKI was listed as the Deputy Minister of War under Tibor ECKHARDT.

RI File # (WFP-3506) is an intelligence report from (dated 15 Sectember 1946, concerning activities of Sulyok FARKAS. Source of the information was and was evaluated F-6. Count Bela TILEMI, who came from Innstruck for a few days, had contact with FARKAS and followers. TELEMI is a very cool-headed and objective man who is rather on the right, but does not have a dangerous prejudice against people.

RJ File #13-8-16-13y3 (Pira 1810) is an intelligence report from (dated 19 August 1949, concerning the Hungarian survey for June-Fuly 1949. The report is evaluated B-3. It reflects that Count Bela TELEKI paid a visit to Paris in June and contacted Baron BAKACH-BESSEMYEY, the Catholic arty leaders, and Tugoslav emigrant Digen JCCIC. Subject's visit aimed to prepare the admission of the members of the 1939 Parliament to the Mational Committee in collaboration with Count Joszef PALPFY who is sponsoring this idea. These Paris telks were without success as neither of the political groups is patronizing this idea, fearing leftist reaction.

RI File #29-8-8-669 (NPPA-3737) is an official dispatch from to Chief, FBW, dated 16 December 1949, conserning count mela THEKI. According to the records of the Visa Section, nonimmigration visa #3397 was issued in Paris on 6 December 1949 to Count Bela TELEKI, hown 16 May 1899 at Holozavar, Hungary, and residing at 92 Avenue de Verdum, Romainville (Seine). who is bearer of French Travel and Identity Certificate //19-AE-03891/07511 issued in Paris on 26 November 1919, is travelling to the United States for a period of one month to visit Joseph EMPEDY, Jesuit House, 259 Fingerboard Street, Statem Island, New York. According to Trench records, Subject came to France from Austria in Pugust 1918 "to prepare emigration plans for certain roups of Hungarian refugees."

Chief of Station, Vienne, to Chief, Foreign Division M, dated 8 December 10h9, concerning miscellaneous Humanian activities. This document reflects that Bela TEVEKI, ECNCZOS, MARIAFFY and Ivan Mary are the ain representatives of an enti-American Hungarian group seeking alliance with the French only. This group, however, is steadily decreasing with resettlement abroad of most of the Hungarians from the French Zone. General PAKO's and TELEKI's groups are seriously considering establishing contact with Marshall TITO and offering him the services of their groups against the present Hungarian Government. They are taking no such action until they sound out French reaction to such a plan.

R! File #200-7-33-15y (PIR-6189) is an intelligence report, from Italy, dated 26 March 1950, concerning ______ Hungarian survey for the period January-February 1950. The report reflects that Count Bela TELEK! went to New York in December 1949 to contact National Council circles and to suggest reorganization of the Council. Council circles let it be known to TELEK! that the U.S. novernment wanted no change in the constitution of the Hungarian Mational Council.

RI File #6-8-1-98 (MAVA-6276) is a USFA Intelligence Report sent from Chief of Station, Vienna, to Chief, FDM, dated 25 July 1:50, concerning ZAKAR, Cedoen, Hungarian Intelligence Agent, in Austria, and evaluated F-k. Farly in 19'.9, ZAKAR contected Count bela TELEKI, Head of the Hungarian Welfare Office in Immsbruck. TELEKI is a leading figure in Hungarian emigre circles. ZAKAR gave the following three reasons for contacting Subject:

- a. To investigate two Hungarians whom he believed were forwarding derogatory information on refugees to Hungary.
 - b. To attempt emigration to France.
 - c. To take up residence in a DP camp in Pregens.

RI File £200-7-33-70 (MAV-2289) is an official digest of the minutes of the Neeting of Hungerian Delfare Representatives on 27 October 1950, forwarded from Vienna, fustria, on 8 December 1950.

The source of information was GROSCHWW and the report evaluation is C-?. From the French Zone, Bela TELEKI, former member of parliament, attended. The subject of the meeting was the problems of fungarian refr gees in fustria, and indicates the difference in conception of colfare work between the Innsbruck and Salaburg offices.

RI File #6-8-1-186 ((7-6) contains GZ-33 of 13 February 1950 which dealt with activities of Count P. TELEXI, the Hungarian emigre in the French one of Anstria. Subject's group established the "Hungarian Union" during the past year as a non-political party organization. The "Thion" seeks to cooperate with the Hungarian Rational Committee, but wants the Committee to be enlarged both to the Right and to the Left. TELEXI reportedly is planning on emigrating to the United States as a DF.

RT File (C7-18) is a copy of a memorandum of a conversation with Dr. Tibor HAM, the Hungarian Peasant Party man in France, on 19 December 1950. HAM warned of the existence of certain political groups trying to establish an opposition National Committee. He stated that the role of Bela TELEKI in Inshruck is obscure, although Subject is definitely anti-National Committee and probably sponsored by the French.

P' Pile 200-7-33-61 is a Department of tate report from Faris, dated 26 December 1950, concerning the political aspects of the Hungarian Digration in France. The Union of Hungarian Deputies was recently established by Count Bela TELEX! with headquarters in the French lone of Austria, as another step in the campaign of certain former Pungarian Parliamentary deputies who have been excluded from membership of the Hungarian National Committee to achieve membership in the Council and its Executive Gummittee. It is this proup's contention that the Hungarian National Council is not sufficiently representative of the Hungarian emigration and that the criteria for membership in the Council have given too much weight to leftist elements and to "Communist collaborators."

RI File 38-7-0-102/y2 (PIR-6395) is an intelligence report from Italy, dated 17 January 1951, concerning Hungarian ectivities for the months of May through December 1950. In Section V, Hungarian Activities in Austria, the document reflects the monthly bulletin of the Parliamentary Group, since June 1 is published under the title: "Unio" (Union). Crief ditors are Baron Janes BORKEHISSZA (ex Foreign Eroadcast Chief of Hungarian Radio) and

Gyrls FATHURECZYT (Transylvanian Party, personal friend of Count Bels TELERY), address Kaiser Franz Josef Strasse 1, Innsbruck.

RT File #200-7-33-97 (TTM-2496) is an intelligence report from Italy, dated 17 August 1951, concerning the Hungarian Mational Council in the MSA and the immigration of MHC members. Source of information is [] and report is evaluated B-0. Count Pela THEET, chairman of the "Unio" Group (Transsylvanian Party) member of the 1939 Parliament, recently arrived in the United States by wirtue of the DP bill.

R' Pile 700-7-71-67 (Pub R, AR-123) contains notes from The Poreign Language Press, Hungarian, dated 15-2" March 1952. The colebration of the American Hungarian Federation, on 16 March in New York's Yorkville Casino, featured Count Hela TELEKI, leader of the conservative UNIO group and member of the Hungarian Mational Council.

The liberal weekly As Ember (March 15) expressed dissatisfaction of the selection of THERT, and called him a "Count on the Extreme Right", "well known of his anti-denocratic principles," who had n ver been elected to the Hungarian Parliament, but had been "invited" into that body of which he wer still a member after Cetober 1911, when the Wazi Szalasi case to power. (Count THERET's speech was anything but "extreme Rightist," but showed rather a moderate, right-of-center tenor).

RY File /100-8-15-50 (PIM-2568) is an intelligence report from Italy, dated 13 January 1952, concerning Hungarian Activities in the UFA. Information was received from ____ and avaluated B-3. Count hala THEMT, Chief of the Conservative Group, published an article recently in the Hungaria and the Party Bulletin, entitled "How Long?", wherein he asked the HCC how long it would delay solving the most urgent problems of emigration. For example, unity; organization of youth and example, resonnel; and cultural and propaganda work. THEMT works in New York in close contact with Tiber ECKH-RDT.

PT File #207-6-20-121 (INS 31982) is a Department of State Airgram Circular, deted 28 Semmary 1953, concerning sources of apprious intelligence information in Western Europe. Aprel LISSAY who is selling sperious information to intelligence agencies in Austria and Testern Europe is believed to contact help TELLET, Immstruck, who would be involved to some extent in the sale of this facticated information.

RI File #32-6-7-3952 (EDLM-710) ir an official dispatch from Chief, EE, to Chief of Mission, Frankfurt, deted 12 April 195h, concerning "Thio" - Hungarian Emigre Monarchist Organisation. This dispatch reflects that Bela TELEM and Lajos MARIAPPI are mentioned in mimerous reports on Hungarian emigre activities. They are listed in MAVA-4252, dated 8 December 1948, as among the main representatives of an anti-American group seeking alliance with the French only.

RI File (UFB-36492) is an THI Internal Security-HE report, dated 29 June 1954, concerning Alexander HITA-HSI, was. He admitted that he often meets bela TELLET in connection with his work at the Hungarian Sational Council.

AT File (NB-32083) is an FM Internal Security-HD report, date: 23 December 1953, concerning Alexander TYIR/EST, was. This report reflects that EMERT stems from an existogratic Mungarian family, but of a different branch from that of the late Prime Minister of Hungary, Paul TELEKT. Subject was the leader of an extreme right-wing political faction in Austria. He appears to have a great deal of meney and it is rumored that this money was allegedly obtained from right-wing elements in France. The thinking of this TEMERI group is that Hungarian relities should take up where they left off in 19.2.

RI File #32-6-7-3747y (2014-7192) is an air dispatch from Chief of Base, Tullach, to Thief, EE, dated 21 January 1954, concerning "Unio," Fungarian Emigre Monerchist Organisation. This decument reflects that "Unio" is an organisation of Rungarian emigres dedicated to the reestablishment of the Dambian Monerchy under Otto won HABSETRG, which organization was organized by the French in Innabruck in 1946 under the Teadership of Count Dela TELLET, who still is at least the nominal leader of the group.
