In Latin America, there were positive developments in a number of countries:

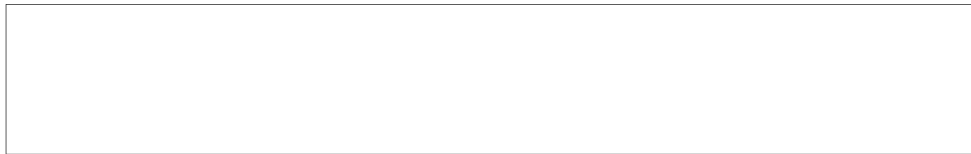

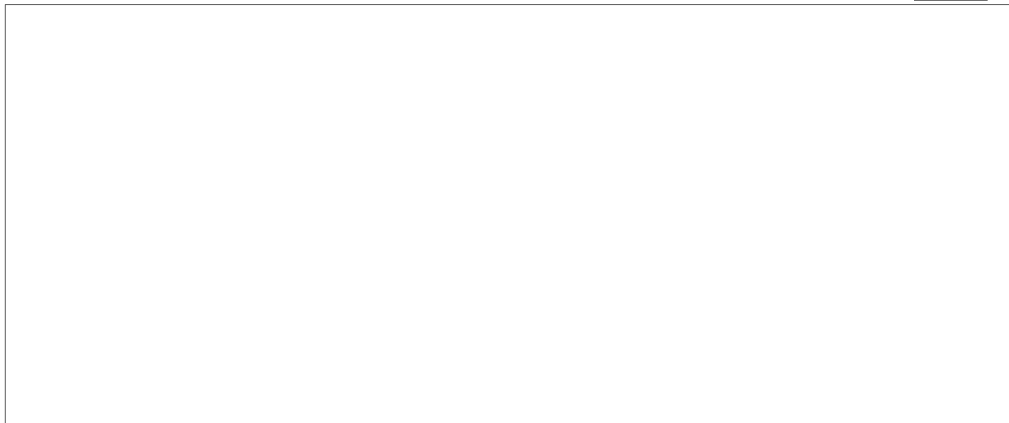

Argentina: Montonero Leader Arrested. Exiled Montonero leaders Ricardo Obregon Cano and Oscar Bidegain returned to Argentina on 20 December to announce the organization's formal dissolution. Obregon Cano was immediately arrested. Earlier this month, five exiled Montonero leaders, including Obregon Cano and Bidegain, published an open letter to President Alfonsin announcing they would return to Argentina to pursue their political objectives through peaceful means.
