He said he had talked to Government sources and to Rabbi Meyer this week to gather information for his story. All three reporters said that "military sources" had told them that the Government had decided to free Lacobo Timerman "within 60 days." They said that Timerman would be freed under right of option and would go to Israel. They added that the Government would pay him \$2,000,000 for his interest in La Opinion. Timerman, they said, already knew of his imminent release. The reporters maintained that military sources had told them in the past that Timerman had remained in custody for so long a time because he had become a symbol to hard-line military groups of the type of non-combatant who had provided "la base" for the growth of terrorism.
