MEMORANDUM FOR THE RECORD

SUBJECT: Front Taynoy Voyny, 1965/1968

1. Returned herewith is the copy of the 1963 edition of Front Taynoy Voyny (Front of the Secret War; by Sergey Ivanovich TSYBOV and Nikolay Fedorovich CHISTYAKOV; Voyenizdat, Moscow), submitted for comparison with the 1965 edition; redpencil markings in this copy indicate points of difference with the 1965 edition and correspond to changes listed in the attachment to this memo.

2. Particular attention should be paid the 1968 version's complete omission of the earlier two-page section decrying STALIN's personality cult, YEZHOV and BERIYA; the later version substitutes a section glossing over this period and covering this omission (see pp. 32-34 in the 1965 edition; pp. 43-49, 1968). At the same time, the new edition includes added mention and praise, not only for DZERZHINSKIY, but also for PETERS, LATSIS, MENZHINSKIY, KEDROV, UNSHLIKHT, TRILISSER and other old-time State Security "heroes".

3. The 1968 edition of Front Taynoy Voyny was expanded and re-written to express anti-American, anti-British and anti-West German sentiment more strongly and to emphasize even more than did the 1965 edition the need for vigilance on all fronts against anti-Soviet elements. A description of the book (found on the last page of the 1968 edition, but not included in the 1965 edition) states that it "acquaints the reader with the heroic deeds of the Soviet counter-intelligence officers who, with the active support of the Border Troops, Soviet soldiers and the people," combat the forces hostile to the Soviet Union.

4. Some of the changes in the 1963 edition were made in an attempt to play down the penalties for failures or momentary lapses of vigilance, indicating that voluntary confession of these lapses and even of recruitment will be treated with "humane understanding". In this connection and throughout the book, State Security personnel and operations of the present day are portrayed even more favorably than in the 1965 edition.

5. Note that the 1968 edition includes none of the earlier edition's specific references to France and the French IS; also, most of the earlier specific mentions of Turkey and the Turkish IS have been eliminated. Note, too, that a number of changes have been made in discussions of the PEN'KOVSKIY and POPOV cases.
