SUBJECT : FEDYNSKI, Member of OUN, Austria

NOTE: The following information was collected from CHAIKOVSKY, UHVR representative in Austria, by PATROCLUS, who is very friendly with him. Although the evaluation is given as B-3, the evaluation of CHAIKOVSKY is necessarily F.

1. SB (Sluzba Bezpeka - Security Service), OUN, has twice dispatched one of its members from Innsbruck to Vienna under pretense of his reporting his illegal crossing of the Soviet frontier into Austria. The man, one FEDYNSKI, had the ultimate objective of being recruited by an American Intelligence Service in Vienna, and in this manner establishing a collaborative contact through which immediate American help might be secured for OUN.

2. The efforts being made by OUN to gain actual American support are apparently stimulated by the organization's disgust with the relations between UHVR and American interests. OUN feels that the contacts provided by UHVR are strictly one-sided, with the Ukrainians assisting the Americans now for some undefined return in the indeterminate future.

3. OUN understands by American contacts the connections developed in Munich by a Ukrainian called KALYNA, whose real name they know is George LOPATINSKY. He was formerly the OUN chief for Western Ukraine and is now UPA representative in Munich. According to OUN, LOPATINSKY promised that Americans will eventually reciprocate in kind for help given them now against the Soviets. OUN, however, suspects that LOPATINSKY's American friends intend only to use the Ukrainians and will never pay for the services rendered.
