Commenting on articles published by the Tomiuri Yeekly (Shukan Yomiuri) in its first issue of 1955 on a quarrel between himself and former/Major General/KANGUCHI Kiyotake 11557/0556/227/0256), TSUJI Mesanobu said on 2 January that it has now become difficult for him to get elected in the coming general election.

1 Field Comment. The Yomiuri Weekly carried articles by RAWAGUCHI and his supporters, former [deutement Ocneral] WACHI Takaji and former (Colone) WATANABE Saburc, and by TSUJI and his supporter OZAKI Shiro. In his article "An Open Letter to TSUJI, Former Staff Officer," KAWAGUCHI charges that TSUJI issued the exder from imperial General Headquarters (IGH) to execute Jose Abados Santos, Chief Justice of the Philippiae Supreme Court, countermanding KAWAGUCHI's efforts to save Santos. It was for this incident that KAWAGUCHI was tried in Manila after the wer and sentenced to seven years' imprisonment. KAWAGUCHI also socuses ISUJI as being responsible for other killings committed by the Japanese in Singapore. The articles by WACHI and FATANABE depict TSUJI se a man of insidious character who knew how to utilize his position us a staff officer in Imperial General Headquarters. TSUI, in his reply to KA4AGUCHI, drnies the charges, ridicules KAYAGUCHI's leadership in the Guadalvanal campaign, and accuses his opponents of being cowards in battles.
