PURGEE ACTIVITY--Former Army Col. MASANOBU TSUJI, one of the foremost strategists of Japan during the Pacific war, has not gome to Korea despite rumors to that effect, Durector MITSUSADA YOSHIKAWA of the Special Examination Bureau of the Office of the Attorney General told a meeting of the Lower House Judiciary Committee on Sept. 19. He said he had reports that Tsuji held a meeting with graduates of the now-defunct Minitary Academy in Niigata City a week ago but that the matter is still being investigated and no official announcement can be made at the present time. It has been definitely established, however, that Tsuji has not gone to Korea, he said, and told the meeting further that his bureau is investigating the alleged political activities of YOSHIICHI MIURA, ICHOZO KOBAYASHI, MAMORU NAGANO, YONEZO MAEDA AND DADAO OASA, purged business leaders. The Special Examination Bureau, Yoshikawa reminded the committee, is exercising vigilance over the activities of rightist organizations just as it is closely watching the movements of extreme leftist elements. Chief NOBORU SAITO of the National Rural Police told the session that members of the National Police Reserve have been closely screened so that there are no Red elements in the new police set-up.
