OPPOSITION TARGET: Probably penetration of the GIS Compound at Pullach with an outside chance that abduction of certain Compound employees is a target.

OPPOSITION CONTACT: Personal contact at an unknown location between the Agent and the Sfs.

SUMMARY: In February 1955, the British notified the GIS that certain persons connected with the GIS Compound at Pullach had turned up as EEI given by the Sfs to an unnamed D/A under British control. The British asked and received permission to pass certain biographical data on the persons as spielmaterial and both the British and the GIS sat back to await further developments. Although the British did not reveal the name of their D/A, the GIS speculated that it was one Camillo Alexander HOELZEL, @Max HOELZEL, who was known to have close connections with the British and who had been employed at the GIS Compound at one time. The GIS further speculated that the original list of names had fallen into the hands of the Sfs through one Hans WEBER, divorced husband of a former employee in the Compound, and himself a former employee of the Civil Censorship Division when it had occupied the compound. Apparently when WEBER left Pullach he had gone to East Berlin to live with his mother and had been interrogated by the Sfs when he had registered with the East Berlin police. The British believed the names were compiled by the Sfs in connection with the possible abduction of certain GIS employees, but the GIS felt that this was too dramatic an approach and held the more conventional view that the Sfs wanted to penetrate the GIS Compound. Rather than risk blowing what could develop into an interesting case by a premature contact with any of the persons involved, GIS adopted a "wait and see" policy. As of this date no significant developments had taken place.
