At 2200 hours, Greengroom 1 left a dinner party with Vienness friends to attend a meeting at Dagembna's residence, and brought along this piece de resistances Dr. Burt SEDLE, Chief of Abtellung 4, Ministry of the piece de remistance: Dr. Bart SEDLER, Chief of Abbeilung 4, Ministry of the Interior, propried to Greengroor 1 a few days ago that his courin had spelon with Ernet TICHER concerning the sale of FISCHER'S residence leated in the American Sector. FISCHER remarked that he was auxious to sell the hose because it was too big for his family. Surprisingly, he stipulated that any prospective purchaser would have to provide his with a two or three-row apartment which was not located in the Seriet Sector, as part of the payment. FISCHER'S provise was interpreted by Greengroour 1 as an indication that the Communist leader is wary of establishing his parament residence in a Soviet sector and by extension that FISCHER may have made this stipulation in order to insure the maintenance of an open door to the West if his position in the IFOs because inreversably presentions. FISCHER was recently under fire from a mammant of the revocably precarious. FISCHE was recently under fire from a segment of the EFOs Central Committee for bengling the Steekholm peace patition program in Austria. There is also a dis-hard contra-FISCHER faction in the Central Committee which derides him for representing the intelligencia and which souks to place the reine of the Central Committee in pletfan hands. 2. Groungrover 1 relayed this tip with tunusual relian expressing the spinion that FISCHER might be ripe for an approach now and scale at least be sounded out on this score by an American who gained entree vie the ruse of interest in purchasing FISCHER'S real estate. Groungrover 1 expressed the belief that FIBCHER would be wary of an instriants approach because of the agant provocateur angle. He affirmed that this was an exclusive scope which hadn't been passed to State Scoretary Ferdinand URLF or the British. The former would have treated it as a choice political morsel thereby dissipating its potential and the latter "apparently don't have funis" to follow up a lead of this sort. 3. The problem of procuring an apartment and subsequently tapping FISCHE'S phone and wiring the precises was discussed, and Greengroose I asserted that he could handle the telephone tap through a good friend, an efficial in the Austrian telephone administration, who rendered invaluable service to the Austrian Police by performing similar work during the recent Communist demonstrations. 4. There are two URBANS of intelligence interest currently in Austria. One is josef, the exaltment efficer, and the other is TRBAN (fau), ex-Sturmbalmführer der Naffen-65. The latter is affiliated with Dr. Adolf INDEXED 11 51-28 A Hilly a Calendaria in the

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SLAYIC and is known to visit Soviet installations in Beden. Recently, it was runored that Josef URBAN had SLAVIG-Soviet connections but this concept has been dispelled through the discovery of the second URBAN'S existence. In his connectary on this matter, Greengrooer 1 mentioned that Josef URBAN had been a State Police source who reported to Dr. Orweld PETRICHOUR through a out-out during 1949. (COMGENT: It can be assumed that he is still doing so.)

5. Recent information received by Greengrooer 1 has convinced him that Georgian SUZZI (See MAYA-6630) and her out—out are fabricating a large portion of their reports. Both were formerly EFCs members. The set-out was custed from the party for embessling funds. Greengreers I consider it unworthy to continue with the BUZZI operation and will instruct his principal agent to discontinue payment to the out-out. He opined that some of the information reported heretofore was gammine, probably drawn from data which the pair had callected while they were EFCs members in good standing. He doesn't feel that it is worthshile to aift their reports for boss fide beyonds in view of the preponderance of fabrication. Hether does he think the BUZZI or her out-out are functioning as Soviet or Commist-controlled fabricators.

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- 6. Greengreer I thinks that the Communists called off their strike last week at the beheat of the Soviets who recognised the futility of the endeavor. By and large, the Soviets maintained a policy of passive cooperation vis-a-vis the KPUs, frequently failing to lend support when it could have been strategically significant and at other times bluntly and comprisonsly interferring when they could have tendered support surreptitionally. We will receive a copy of Greengreer 1's report to Minister Oskar HEZME on the subject of Soviet intervention during the demonstrations. Greengreer I will also give us obstracts of his analysis on the demonstration-strike complex which was also prepared for Minister HEZME. He refused to give us the verbatia report as it deploted memorous strictly Austrian Ooverment matters, i.e. evaluation of provincial Security Director's performance, comments on the afficiency of Visnna police personalities, etc.
- 7. To a large extent, the strike was broken by an overwholsing respority of the nation's non-Communist workers who failed to support it because of their strong appealtion to Communist and Seriet dootrine and not because they were in favor of the new wage-price agreement. This pact is viewed with disfavor by the bulk of the non-Communist workers.
- 8. Greengroose I has had no information on the EPCs's analysis of the recent errest. He feels that Central Counties numbers are now in the process of preparing reports on the subject. There have been some recors circulating regarding fature plans for EFCs-inspired strikes and demonstrations but none of these runors have been substantiated. One of the most paraistant mentions that the turnoil will start again in December when the Soviets have

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control of the lat Bezirk. Orsengroses I is disinclimed to credit this scho as the record shows that the lat Bezirk is always quietest during the Soviet south.

9. A Catholia Action body exists in Austria, but it is not conspicuous politically. It functions primarily as a moral-building factor for the population. The Catholia Action's political views are frequently contained in ONTP directives, but the Catholia Action has by as means thrown in its lot unreservedly with the ONTP. Consistantly, it expresses views diametrically opposed to those of the CoVP. MAUER (fine), is one of the Catholia Action's leading activists in Yiema.

10. Greengroose I transmitted a score of typewritten reports most of which originated with the Vererlberg unit. Time did not permit us to review their contents and, therefore, this will be done at the maxt session. It is of interest to note that in a brief commentary, Greengroose I heartily proposed that we refer to his principal agent as "our man" (rather than as the Verarlberg unit) and that he stated "these (reports) are what you are paying for". Further, that two reports evidently originated with the Security Directorate for Garinthia and that one came from Stayr in the Opper Amstrian Security Director's province.

Il. Greengroom I is substituting for State Secretary CRAF as the leader for a pilgrimage of approximately 500 employees of the police, Geniarmarie, and customs whe are departing for Rome on a Soly Year visit to the Pope. At the last minute, CRAF had to cancel his plans to lead the delegation because Minister Earl CRUESE is in Washington and Chancellor Leopald FILL will be absent on a trip to the Scaniansvian countries. CRAF requested Greengroom I to not in his steed and to present his regrets to Ralian Minister of the Interior Mario SCRIAM, to the Pope, and to other officials who were to have received CRAF. CRAF also cautioned Greengroom I to keep the group out of the limilight since Minister HELMER and other Socialist leaders took a dim view of the visit and had expressed the opinion that the trip should not be construed by the Italian authorities as an official Austrian representation. The group will entrain on Saturday evening and will remain in Italy for one week.

12. In Greengrooer 1's absence, routine affairs will be handled with his reports officer, Dr. Evil BETTHIN, and energency matters of significance will be called to the attention of his deputy, Dr. Frank Milk, as has been done in the past when Greengrooer 1 was not on the local scene.

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
