As requested, following traces drawn from correspondence  
other than that which originated with [ ]

KUTAŠ, Jaroslav: VITAL 916, 9 April 1951, Jaroslav KUTAŠ,  
a "former Czech double agent", is mentioned as a contact of FRAN ULOVÍČ.

KUTAŠ, Jaroslav: No traces.

CZIRAK, Petr: No traces.

URAY, Josef: Please refer to XOL 8000.

DYKANOV of KOMOŘÍ, alias KUTAŠ: No traces. We note, however, that the  
subject of XOL 8878 is reported to be in contact with a Monsieur DOUDÉ  
of the French Security as well as engaged in Vienna.

PYATOSCHKO, Peter: CIO, Headquarters CIO (rear) report, dated 26  
January 1950, entitled "American Kidnapping for the Soviets"; a brief  
reference to CIO's investigation of the kidnapping, scheduled for 30  
December 1949, of Peter PYATOSCHKO, an associate of George GULIDOVICH,  
Ukrainian DP of doubtful background and loyalties who worked with CIO  
Vienna early and mid-1949. SUMMARY OF REFERENCES

XOL 9081, 16 November 1950, mentions CIO Vienna report, XOL 8-11944  
26 June 1951, which concerns the interrogation of Peter PYATOSCHKO, who  
was released from the custody of C.I.C. Salzburg and transported to  
Germany 1 April 1950. Headquarters does not have a copy of this report  
on file.

EWAL-7737, 8 March 1961: A Vienna tailor named Peter IVANOVICH, at one time a target for one of the kidnapping bands in the English Counter-Sabotage case, is mentioned as a friend of Ladislav SIKHIEVICZ\* (phonetic), a Polish Ukrainian who was mastered out of the Soviet Army in Vienna sometime in 1948 and chose to remain in Austria rather than report to Warsaw as directed.

DMURKA, Stefan: No traces.

JANTSYK, Anna: No traces.

VOLOSHIN, Vasyl: 07-7385, dated 4 March 1948:  
VOLOSHIN (fam), premier of the Carpatho-Ukraine at Skopje-Koltokhovets; notorious founder of the Union for Liberation of the Ukraine (1914-18); tried to bring SKOROPATSKY, leader of the pro-German Ukrainian Nationalistic Movement abroad (now living in Germany). VOLOSHIN and RYTAJ, Ukrainian nationalist, now believed to be in Poland, were members of his government (2nd) at Russkij. The date and origin of this information are not known.

Both KOUBOVICZ, who is identical with VOLUBOVICH, and SIKHIEVICZ are well known to you.
