As requested, following traces drawn from correspondence other than that which originated with FOU.

LETASSCH, Jaroslav: VIVA-906, 9 April 1951; Jaroslav WELTON, a "former Czech double agent", is mentioned as a contact of Trass KLI-OVIC.

ENTRACH, Jaroslav: No traces.

CZIRAK, Petros: No traces.

URBAN, Josef: Please refer to MOLA 9004.

DUBANAY or ICHOVAY, alias WELTON: No traces. We note, however, that the subject of MOLA 8878 is reported to be in contact with a Monsieur ICHOVAY of the French Security as Obligations in Vienna.

IVANOSCHKO, Petros: COBI, Headquarters USTA (rear) report, dated 26 January 1950, entitled "Americans Kidnapping for the Soviets"; a brief reference to COBI frustration of the kidnapping, scheduled for 20 December 1949, of Peter IVANOSCHKO, an associate of George GULIBOVICH, a Ukrainian DP of doubtful background and loyalties who worked with CIO Vienna early and mid-1949. **SUMMARY OF REFERENCES**

MAYA 7061, 16 November 1950, mentions CIO Vienna report, MOIS V-11944 of June 1951, which concerns the interrogation of Peter IVANOSCHKO, who was released from the custody of CS Salzburg and transported to Germany 1 April 1950. Headquarters does not have a copy of this report on file.

NYA-777, 8 March 1961: A Vienna tailor named Peter IVANOSKID, at one time a target for one of the kidnaping bands in the Czech-Counter-Snatch case, is mentioned as a friend of Ladislav SIKKIEVICZ (phonetic), a Polish Ukrainian who was mustered out of the Soviet Army in Vienna sometime in 1948 and chose to remain in Austria rather than report to Warsaw as directed.

DEJURKA, Stefan: No traces.

IVANOSKID, Ivan: No traces.

VOLOSCHIN, Wasyl: OY-7385, dated 4 March 1946:

VOLOSCHIN (fma), premier of the Carpatho-Ukraine at Skerpie-Ioltokhovskiy; notorious founder of the Union for Liberation of the Ukraine (1914-18); tried to bring SKONPATSKY, leader of the pro-German Ukrainian Nationalistic Movement abroad (now living in Germany), VOLOSCHIN and RYBAY, Ukrainian nationalist, now believed to be in Poland, were members of his government (as) at Kuzest. The date and origin of this information are not known.

Both RO UBOWICZ, who is identical with COLUBOVICH, and SIKKIEVICZ are well known to you.
