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

In Purpose of this Report. The purpose of the present report is to report the reaction of ir, billion huriff, and his immediate eronice to the same that State VILLE and Eart FONCE had been arrested together with three other purpose for explosings on behalf of the Service Union against the United States. HITTL's reaction is documented in correspondence between himself and his cromice which was impounded in a search of his quarters and office conducted on 15 March 1953. 12. Comments, From the correspondence detailed above, it would appear that MCETTL was waitling in his association with Curt POWIER and the Tophale complexa-It should be noted, however, that the fact that all of this sorrespondence was se easily eccessible in MCETTL's house leads one to suspect that MCETTL intended to to empture it and from this suspiction it is a short stop to the suspiction that all or some of the correspondence may have been fabricated for the purpose of giving as documentary evidence which appears to alser MCSTL of suspicion and that other more incriminating correspondence has been destroyed or hidden elementers. The fact that also confiscated at the same time were numerous records of HCTTTL's elandestine activity which, as he points out biaself, establishes his elear enti-Soviet record in espiences, albeit detracting to a degree from his reputation as a master in the trade, is consistent with the theory that the material was deliberately left in his house.
