<p>The following list of KOLLERNYI's probable contacts and acquaintances, and the biographic data on them, were extracted from his 201 file for the period 1948 to 1955. The exact relationship, when specified in the file, is included with the name. Traces were not run on them; because without feed-back and focus from CASCOPE, we are hesitant to conduct more extensive research.</p> <p>Please maritime and pass to CASCOPE. If you also are unable to identify the several ancient crypts included, please change these entries to LNU, fnu.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. János ^HAMBRUS apparently worked for the Americans through KOLLERNYI and for the French through Josef ^HVEGH. In 1950 he was arrested in Hungary while on an exfiltration mission. <input type="checkbox"/> 2. Nikolai ^HARNOLD met Subject circa 1954. He is probably identical to Dr. Nikolaus ARNOLD, born 1 May 1899 in Rumania, who in 1954 was a journalist and was associated in some way with Josef ^HGENSBURG. 3. Fan ^HBATJAN worked for Subject in "Developmental Project 35" circa 1949. 4. Senator ^HBIRO was a person whom Subject tried to introduce to Emil ^HSZALANCZY in 1948, possibly as an agent candidate. 5. László ^HCZETENYI, Chief of the Hungarian Caritas Mission in 1951, conducted refugee debriefings, probably resultant information to KOLLERNYI. <p style="text-align: right;">continued. . .</p>

6. Jozsef CZIKELY, who resided in Liefering-Rott, was a member of Subject's group in 1952. He is probably identical to the Major or Colonel Fnu CZIKELY who conducted agent training for Subject in Salzburg circa 1950 and the Fnu CZIKELY (c Dr. GUTTMAN, c BOSSZU) who was a regular debriefer for Subject in 1950.

7. Johann DANZINGER, born 28 June 1925 in Vienna, was possibly one of Subject's contacts in 1952 for information about Danube shipping.

8. Dr. Eugen (or Jeno) DECLEVA was a close associate of Imre KLEIN. In 1950 DECLEVA reportedly peddled information on Josef VEGH, the Italians, the EMD, and/or General ZAKO's organization.

9. Fnu DIETRICH, who was with the Hungarian Welfare Office in Salzburg in 1950, probably directed refugee sources to Subject.

10. Herbert DOHAL (c MALKER), born 24 February 1917 in Marburg, recruited KOLLENYI to work for Rupert MANIK.

11. General Ferenc von FARKAS (c KESZARNAK), formerly with the Hungarian Army, was trying in 1950 to assume leadership of the MHEK. He may be identical to the Ferenc FARKAZ (sic) who in 1950 worked at the MIS (formerly CIC) Screening Center in Salzburg after being placed there by Subject's recruiting team. He may also be identical to the Ferenc FARKAS, who by 1955 no longer worked for Subject and was the instigator of much conflict within Subject's group.

12. Friedrich FRANK (V-14415), born 4 February 1909 in Pomerania, the Det. 2 case officer who turned Josef GINSBURG over to Subject.

13. Andrej GARZIK (c Andrea HOKER) worked at the MIS Screening Center in 1951 and gave refugee debriefing reports to Bertalan SZENDROGHI (who passed some to KOLLENYI), to Fnu TAKACH (for Detachment 38 in Lina), and to Albin KAPITANFFY (for the French).

14. Captain Fnu GERENCSEI was in charge of the defensive intelligence section of Subject's group in Salzburg in 1950. He may be identical to Mihaly GERENCSEI, who was a Hungarian Nazi agent in Switzerland in 1944.

15. Lieutenant Erwin GEVAY was General ZAKO's adjutant in 1950.

16. Josef GINSBURG (V-14921), born 24 March 1908 in Rumania, was the asset whom Friedrich FRANK turned over to Subject about 1954.

17. Major Arpad GOSSY was an office worker for Subject's group in Salzburg in 1950.

18. was an interpreter for Emil SZALANCZY circa 1950.

19. Fnu HANYAS, like Fnu DIETRICH, worked in the Hungarian Welfare Office in Salzburg in 1950 and probably directed refugee sources to Subject.

20. Istvan HEGEDUS (or HEGEDUS) (V-17878 ?) was placed in the MIS Screening Center in Salzburg by KOLLENYI's recruiting team sometime before or during 1950. At that time, he was probably also associated with Hugo TRUX. By 1952 HEGEDUS, using the alias of BARSONY, worked as a "legman and fingerman" for Subject's group. By December 1953, however, he had broken with Subject and/or his group and reportedly tried to spread dissension within it for revenge.

21. Arpad HENKHI spotted refugees which he referred to Subject.

22. General Gustav HENNYEY, a former Hungarian Army officer, was the subject of at least one of KOLLENYI's reports in 1950.

23. Michael HOKLER (c ADLER, c Michael HANAGY HALLER) (V-14783),

born 10 June 1920 in Hungary. was an agent whom Subject directed in 1954. []

24. Laszlo HORI (or HORY) (V-14703), General ZAKO's secretary, was described in 1950 as an informant for Subject. Earlier an attaché at the Hungarian Embassy in Belgrade, he became a journalist in the 1950's. []

25. László HORVATH may have been one of Subject's refugee sources in 1951. []

26. Géza JELENCIS (V-14615), born 11 February 1929 in Hungary, occasionally visited the Caritas School in Salzburg in the early 1950's in the company of Kálmán BOESZKE, a self-proclaimed CIC border crosser. JELENCIS, however, was recruited by the BND in January 1951 as a border crosser and a "flying observer." He was one of the agents whom KOLLENYI directed, but he had been dropped by 1954. []

27. Father JOSEF, with the West Bahnhof Mission in Vienna, was in contact with Subject about 1951, probably in connection with Father JOSEF's interest in Caritas Mission work. []

28. Oliver KADAR was a refugee whom Subject debriefed in 1950. Subject later denied that he had debriefed KADAR and asked Hugo TRUX to forget that he had earlier admitted this to TRUX. []

29. Ferenc KANTOR (V-14451), born 20 September 1922 in Hungary, was one of the agents whom KOLLENYI controlled for the BND during the early 1950's. []

30. Albin KAPITANYI was the CE man for ZAKO's organization(s). In 1950 he gave MHEK information to Subject for the BND and allegedly also gave information to the French. []

31. Dr. Karl Kurt KLINI, who worked for Subject in Salzburg in 1950 and who was the brother-in-law of Colonel ZSOLNYAI, may be identical to Dr. László KLINI. []

32. Miklós KOPONAY, born 25 September 1912 in Szombately, was a member of the KOPJAS Group and worked for CIC in 1947. About 1950, when he was in charge of the Press and Propaganda Section of the MHEK, he drew up the agreement between KOLLENYI and the MHEK whereby KOLLENYI paid a regular sum to receive MHEK intelligence reporting. In 1951, however, ZAKO dropped him from the MHEK. []

33. Ferenc KOVACS (G TASHADY-KOVACS) ran his own network into Hungary in competition with Subject as early as 1948, when KOVACS was invited to merge with ZAKO. []

34. Andre KOZMA, who was with VOA, knew Subject as early as 1951. In 1955 he was responsible for blowing Subject and his activities to the AVH. []

35. Baron Victor KRUCHINA, a British IS operative in the "CHIC" in Millstatt, was a source for information KOLLENYI and KOPONAY collected for the CIC until circa December 1947 when KRUCHINA severed his connections with them. []

36. Bela LANCZY (V-17579/C), a member of the P(H)ICHLER group, debriefed refugees in various cafes in Vienna in 1951. In 1952 he was described as a member of the GECCZE (SZENDROEI ?) group of intelligence swindlers in Austria. He alternately claimed to work for the French, British, BND, and CIC. []

37. David LESZLI interrogated refugees in Vienna until 1951 when he migrated to Australia. []

38. Aurel LINZAY (G SZILASSY) received an invitation in 1949 from KOLLENYI to join him in Austria as an intelligence operative. []

39. Emil^H LUDMANN replaced SZALANCZY in Subject's LINZ group.
40. Rupert^H MANDEL (MANDEL) (V-14400) was chief of Det. 2
41. Janos^H MARKOVITS was a refugee whom Subject debriefed in 1950. Subject later denied that he had debriefed MARKOVITS and asked Hugo TRUX to forget that he had earlier admitted this debriefing to TRUX.
42. Lajos^H HADAS was a source for ZAKO's organization in 1950.
43. Gosh^H NAGY monitored Hungarian police radio traffic for ZAKO and the British.
44. a former Hungarian military attache in Poland, was an informant for Subject.
45. a former member of the Hungarian Army, was in contact with both KOLLENYI and Emil SZALANCZY. KOLLENYI had helped him get a job in Salzburg in 1946.
46. Lajos^H NOVISZELAK, who resided in Zell in 1948, directed refugee sources to Subject.
47. Franz^H ORBAN, the MEREK representative in Switzerland in 1950, is probably identical with Franz^H URBAN
48. Karl^H PILAS, born 31 August 1917 in Yugoslavia, was a ship's engineer in 1951 and may have been in contact with Subject.
49. Josef^H POLYAK, described in 1950 as a blackmarketeer and professional smuggler, was recruited by Sandor VISHNYI as a courier into Hungary. POLYAK participated in at least one exfiltration mission.
50. Dr. Vassil^H RADONV (V-17520), a former medical officer in the Bulgarian Army, debriefed Bulgarian refugees in Graz for Imre KLEIN and/or the BND. About 1951 he apparently had a disagreement with KOLLENYI (degree of seriousness not specified).
51. Henrik^H RATKY (V-10071) a close friend of DECLEVA, worked as an informant until he was dropped in June 1949 ~~as a~~ hostile recruitment pitch by the British IS.
52. Istvan^H SALKEZ was described in 1953 as probably working for Subject.
53. Josef^H SZAZAL, who lived in Vienna and who was an employee of a Danube shipping firm, was listed in 1952 among Subject's possible contacts.
54. Josef^H SCHMIDT, described in 1950 as a blackmarketeer and professional smuggler, was recruited as a courier into Hungary and participated in at least one exfiltration mission.
55. Frau^H STADLER sold information to Bertalan SZENDROEI and Bela LANCZY in 1951.
56. Laszlo^H SUMEI, the chief storekeeper at the Caritas Mission in Salzburg, spotted new refugees for Subject's group and was a contact of Laszlo^H SEITA.
57. Emil^H SZALANCZY (H HAUER), who at one time worked for the British, was handled by KOLLENYI for CIC in 1948. For some time, he was chief of KOLLENYI's Graz network, but later he moved to Salzburg.
58. János^H SZANTO (V-14911), born 15 August 1928 in Szekesfehervar, was once a technical draftsman in Hungary, but resided in Salzburg in 1952.

Colonel Karoly ^HSZITA (V-14601), born 3 April 1897 in Andrashida, was an agent handler in Det. 2 in 1950. Before the war, SZALANCZY had served under him in the G-2 Section of the Debrecen Army Corps in Hungary. <input type="checkbox"/> <input type="checkbox"/></p> <p>62. Dr. Kornel ^HTARCSALY, born 20 May 1921 in Budapest, was described as the MHEK representative in Switzerland in 1950. <input type="checkbox"/> <input type="checkbox"/></p> <p>63. Vince ^HTEGLAS, a blackmarketeer and professional smuggler, was recruited by Sandor VISHNYI as a courier into Hungary. Ilona ^HVORCH was a friend of Oliver KADAR and Janos MARKOVITS, who used her residence in 1950 to meet their contacts, etc. <input type="checkbox"/> <input type="checkbox"/></p> <p>65. Hugo ^HTRUX was a co-worker with KOLLENYI for CIC in 1949 and 1950. <input type="checkbox"/> <input type="checkbox"/></p> <p>68. Sandor ^HVISHNYI (V-14470), born 25 May 1917 in Hungary, was in contact with TRUX in 1950. He was in charge of offensive intelligence and agent training in Salzburg for Subject. László ^HVURAY (V-14761), born 6 June 1925 in Budapest, directed a radio intercept program in Austria, but was terminated 20 February 1954. Andreas ^HWEISZ (V-14852), born 4 March 1929 in Smombathely, was dropped in December 1952. <input type="checkbox"/> <input type="checkbox"/></p> <p>72. Josef ^HWESZELICS, a blackmarketeer and professional smuggler, was recruited by Sandor VISHNYI as a courier into Hungary. He participated in at least one exfiltration mission. <input type="checkbox"/> <input type="checkbox"/></p> <p>73. Jozsef ^HXIKELY (V-14701), worked for Det. 2 until he was dropped on 28 February 1954. <input type="checkbox"/> <input type="checkbox"/></p> <p>74. Mihaly ^HZSOLNAY (V-17579/G) worked in "Project 34," probably under Karoly SZITA.
