CAMPION

1. For your information, we are passing along ZACALICO's evaluation of the generator photos transmitted with N.B. 11735, 11736 and 11774; "In the absence of collateral information, it is impossible to estimate the significance or the intelligence value of the photographs. Furthermore, in the absence of knowledge of the character of the source, we suspect that all of the submitted photographs are fabrications. We suggest that the source be investigated in order to determine whether or not he is trustworthy before any further attempt is made to elicit information of intelligence value."
2. ZACALICO evaluations of the plaques and tabs sent with N.B. 11727 and 11781 are as follows: These plaques and tabs are fabricated and have no authenticity.
3. N.B. 11966 was evaluated as follows:
It is not normal for uranium ore trains to be dispatched from Singen-Johannes although there have been some indications that a small amount of ore is sent to Chemnitz and is prepared for shipment there. The normal number of freight cars in a uranium train from Wiesbaden is 45 to 50 instead of the 6 to 14 mentioned in this report.
4. Comments on N.B. 11493 were dispatched as WOKW 10363, dated 24 August.
5. According to ZACALICO, N.B. 11643 and 11374 could not be judged.
6. There was no dissemination of N.B. 12034 since the information was considered trivial.
7. The sole good evaluation of a CAMPION report would seem to be ZACALICO's evaluation of N.B. 11967, which was: This is a good report (sic) and contains considerable detail.
