Kieu said that domestic political considerations had led the Americans to press on Thieu many proposals disadvantageous to SVN. The GVN must resist this pressure until the American elections are held. Kieu said his brother would never concede to the Americans and was prepared to leave the Presidency if the Americans cut off financial aid to the GVN or to die if there was an attempt against his life. Thieu preferred, Kieu said, a respected name in history to living shamelessly like a dog obeying its master's every command.
