King Peter plens to visit New York, Washington, D.C., Los Angeles, Chicago, Pittaburgh, Pennsylvenia, and possibly other cities where there is a concentration of Tugoslave (Serbs).

Serbian Organisations, Church Groups, fraternal societies, sad American-Serbian circles to arrange appropriate receptions and to organize festivities during the King's

visit in this Country. King Peter's itinerary in Washington, D.C., will include visits with members of the United States Congress and meetings with Yugoslave residing in Washington, D.C., who were formerly associated with the Royal Yugoslav Government.

c. King Peter's pressure (as in past visits to the United States) is ostensibly designed to revive the old political theme of exiled Berbs, that by giving aid to Tito, America is supporting
