The purpose of this dispatch is to inform the addressee(s) of Subject, OGATA Chunaku (1442/1748/0193/0159) [REDACTED] an Japanese presently living in Macao who has a record of intelligence activity with the Japanese and Chinese since the 1930's, to promote an option to nullify the activities of an alleged narcotics ring within its ranks in Macao.

On 6 July 1959, MARUYAMA Koju, the Chief of the Third Public Security Section (PSG) of the Tokyo Metropolitan Police Department (MPD), informed members of Tokyo Station via official liaison that he had been informed by a personal friend, WACHI Isamu [REDACTED], formerly a General in the Japanese Army, that Subject was in a position to help the Japanese Government and the United States military authorities in their effort to smash a narcotics ring, sponsored by the Chinese Communists, and with bases in Hong Kong and Macao. MARUYAMA passed on a photocopy of Subject's letter to WACHI, which is dated 13 April 1959. Attached is a translation of that letter, and Attachment B is a translation of Subject's biographical sketch of Subject. MARUYAMA also asked us if we might be interested in having him show an interest through MACAO [REDACTED] in our proposal.

In August 1959, we informed MARUYAMA that we were not interested in Subject or his proposal, and on 5 October, we passed him a sterilized report concerning OGATA's intelligence activities in China and the Hong Kong Macao bases, the information extracted from [REDACTED] files. We stated in this report that Subject seems to have professional information who had attempted in the spring of 1954 to sell a fantistic proposal to the Japanese Foreign Ministry to bring about, with United States help, the defection of CHOU En-lai, who had recently told one of Subject's contacts, Major-General YANG An-kuei, the son of YANG Hu, who is close to CHOU, that he, (CHOU), would be willing to cooperate with the Americans to bring about a split between Communist China and the Soviet Union. We also stated in the report that IS'U P'ing-fa, a well-known thug, had approached Americans in Tokyo in 1952 with a plan to overthrow the Chinese Communist regime with the aid of one of his trusted contacts, including YANG Hu and CHANG Chie-chung, who are willing to participate in this scheme.

In his letter to the Japanese Foreign Minister of 23 March 1954, which contained the proposal to defect CHOU En-lai, Subject stressed the need by the Japanese to keep his plan secret from the British and American agents in Hong Kong. He, therefore, suspect that Subject has had previous dealings with these people in Hong Kong with unrewarding results.
