CSCE: CHIEF U.S. DELEGATE ZIMMERMANN SUMS UP VIENNA DEBATE

1. REVIEWING THE VIENNA CSCE TALKS IN A "KURIER" INTERVIEW DECEMBER 18, U.S. AMBASSADOR WARREN ZIMMERMANN SAID THE U.S. HAS BEEN ENGAGED IN A "STRAIGHTFORWARD AND CANDID" DEBATE OVER CSCE NON-COMPLIANCE. WHILE NOTING OCCASIONAL "IRRITATED AND ANGERED" EASTERN REACTION TO CRITICISM, AMBASSADOR ZIMMERMANN CREDITED THE SOVIETS WITH A "CONSTRUCTIVE" APPROACH TO THE IMPLEMENTATION

DEBATE. BUT HE EXPRESSED DISAPPOINTMENT OVER SOVIET FAILURE TO RESPOND TO MANY U.S. QUESTIONS. DUE TO INCREASED EAST-WEST DIALOGUE THE WORLD-CLIMATE HAS CLEARLY IMPROVED SINCE MADRID, HE OBSERVED. GORBACHEV HAS A MORE "OPEN" AND "FLEXIBLE" APPROACH, THE U.S. AMBASSADOR SAID. AT THE SAME TIME ZIMMERMANN DEPLORED THAT THE AREA OF HUMAN RIGHTS HAS ONLY SEEN "PROMISES" SO FAR AND THAT MOSCOW'S FAILURE IN THIS MATTER UNDERMINED THE ENTIRE CSCE PROCESS. AMONG U.S. EXPECTATIONS FROM THE DEBATE THE U.S. AMBASSADOR LISTED "MORE STABILITY" REGARDING CONVENTIONAL ARMS, IMPROVED CONDITIONS FOR EAST-WEST TRADE, MORE COOPERATION IN THE FIELD OF NUCLEAR SAFETY, AND STRICT SOVIET COMPLIANCE WITH HUMAN RIGHTS. AUSTRIA AND OTHER NNA COUNTRIES HAVE BEEN PLAYING A CONSTRUCTIVE ROLE IN THE CSCE PROCESS, THE AMBASSADOR STRESSED. (INDEPENDENT KURIER, DECEMBER 17)

2. IN THE CONTEXT OF A "POSITIVE INTERNATIONAL ATMOSPHERE", U.S. "BEHAVIOR" AT THE VIENNA CSCE FOLLOW-UP TALKS HAD BROUGHT "NEGATIVE EXPERIENCES", CHIEF SOVIET CSCE DELEGATE YURI KASHLEV, SPEAKING IN AN INTERVIEW FOR THE DAILY "KURIER", SAID IN HIS ASSESSMENT OF THE MEETING SO FAR. THE "AGGRESSIVE U.S. POSITION" AT THE FORUM REFLECTED THE "DANGEROUS LINE" OF THE ADMINISTRATION, WHICH HAD AS ITS GOAL THE BREACH OF EXISTING ARMS TREATIES, KASHLEV SAID. INCREASED U.S. CRITICISM OF SOCIALIST COUNTRIES IS JUST AN ATTEMPT TO COMPENSATE FOR AMERICA'S DWINDLING IMAGE FOLLOWING THE IRAN-CONTRA SCANDAL, KASHLEV CLAIMED. A HIGHLY FLEXIBLE USSR HAS ENTERED THE TALKS WITH MANY NEW PROPOSALS. HIS VIEW WESTERN EUROPE NO LONGER SOUGHT CONFRONTATION WITH THE EAST. THE REVIEW CONFERENCE SHOULD PRODUCE "PRACTICAL RESULTS" REGARDING THE REDUCTION OF CONVENTIONAL WEAPONS AND INTENSIFY EAST-WEST ECONOMIC RELATIONS. WE HAVE ALSO LEARNED A LOT FROM CHERNOBYL, KASHLEV SAID. ON HUMAN RIGHTS THE USSR IS MAKING CONSIDERABLE EFFORTS CURRENTLY, HE NOTED, BUT DEPLORED "PROPAGANDA AND PSYCHOLOGICAL WARFARE" ON THIS ISSUE. PARTICIPATION OF HUMAN RIGHTS ORGANIZATIONS AT THE PROPOSED HUMAN RIGHTS CONFERENCE IN MOSCOW IS STILL OPEN TO NEGOTIATION, KASHLEV STATED. HE CLEARLY SPOKE OUT FOR A MORE ACTIVE ROLE ON THE PART OF THE NNA NATIONS, MENTIONING AUSTRIA IN PARTICULAR. THE SOVIET DELEGATE JUDGED THE PRESENT WORLD SITUATION MORE FAVORABLE FOR CSCE THAN WHAT IT LOOKED DURING THE MADRID FOLLOW-UP CONFERENCE.
