Subject: Apprehension of alleged agent.

The Bavarian BP Kommissariat Furth im Wald reports:

"On May 19, 1950, the Czech Evzen VITEK (born on July 17, 1924 in Stidne in the district of Kamenice/CSR, married, chemist, inmate of the Valka camp in Nürnberg) was arrested by BP Stelle Waldmünchen for repeated illegal crossing of the border and was delivered with proper charges to the court jail in Cham.

Investigations have brought out that Vitek crossed the border the first time illegally from the CSR to Bavaria on 3/4 Nov, 1949, near Selb. He said that he met with a CIC officials in Selb and returned at once to the CSR. On Dec 20, 1949, he crossed again the border illegally near Selb in order to evade arrest in the CSR. Then he was tried before the Military Court in Hof and sent into the Valka camp in Nürnberg. On April 17, 1950, he was again apprehended after illegal crossing near Hßll and was delivered to the court jail in Cham. At that time he carried a Czech identification card No. 200701/26 issued to Petr NAVRATIL (chemist, born on July 1, 1920, in Pilsen/CSR) on Oct 10, 1949, by the chief of police in Pilsen/CSR. Apparently he used that name, too.

On May 19, the day when Vitek was apprehended, an automobile was stopped on the Waldmünchen-Hßll road and the following occupants of the car were checked:

- 1) Dr. Josef URBAN, physician, born on May 21st, 1910, in Kattowitz, living at Neu-Ulm, Kirchstrasse 11;
- 2) Walter Schulte, pharmacist, German, married, born on July 12, 1917 in Essen/Westfalen, son of Josef and Franziska Schulte nee Lhotak, living at Frankfurt/Main, Schaumainkai No. 15;
- 3) Alfred WALDMANN, commercial agent, born on August 12, 1920, in Prague, single, son of Karl and Erika Waldmann nee Ziegler, living at Nürnberg, Fürtherstrasse 160

These persons said they were waiting for a man, whose name they did not want to divulge. From their conversation it could be taken that it was Vitek they were waiting for.

At the same time, 2 women were checked at the Waldmünchen RR station, who had come by taxicab from Munsidel to Waldmünchen for the purpose of calling for a certain Hoffmann. The names of the two women were:

- 1) Margit WALDMANN, maid, born on July 9, 1925, in Karlsbad/CSR/;
- 2) Irma MODEL, agricultural teacher, born on March 4, 1929, in Libkowitz.

The two women are living in Wunsiedel, Maximilianstrasse 25, and are said to be employed by an American secret agency in Wunsiedel. It is assumed that "Hoffmann" was also identical with the apprehended Vitek.

From the above it may be concluded that Vitek is actually working for an American agency. CIC Kötzing, which was notified at once, took the occupants of the automobile and taxicab to CIC headquarters in Regensburg. The US Resident Officer in Waldmünchen and Cham has been informed.
