SUBJECT Operational/CATIE/C [] DIAZAG UJERRAUFUL			
ACTION REQUIRED - REFERENCES			
<p>References: EGUA-65579, 20 November 1964</p> <p>1. The restaurant described in paragraph 2 of reference was quite readily identified as the "Langlinsepavillon", which is owned and managed by the Royal Yacht Club of Denmark, which also maintains its club rooms on the second floor of the building. It is a place which is quite popular with visiting businessmen, especially the more affluent West German ones.</p> <p>2. During a meeting with [] he confirmed this conclusion on our part by stating that he had again had to waste a nice Sunday by having to surveil a meeting between Josef LERSKY [] and UJERRAUFUL's DIAZAG agent. The meeting took place at the Langlinsepavillon on 6 December and lasted for more than two hours. LERSKY and the DIAZAG agent occupied a table with a view towards the 'Seem' and they were counter-surveilled by no less than four employees of the local Czech Legation: Jaroslav GRAML [] had parked his car slightly north of the restaurant and walked along the water to the restaurant, constantly checking for surveillance on him and for any suspicious persons. Frantisek HORA [] parked his automobile south of the restaurant and walked towards it by a circuitous route which brought him past the [] headquarters which probably would have made it possible for him to observe any surveillance activities that [] might have mounted. Mrs. Frantisek HORA was escorted by herself in the restaurant and constantly watched LERSKY and the DIAZAG agent. After the meeting was concluded and the DIAZAG agent had departed, LERSKY and GRAML departed for the Czech Legation presumably to get rid of some documents or other material that the DIAZAG agent had turned over to LERSKY. HORA and his wife went to their home separately.</p> <p>3. We asked [] for the names of the CATIE officers involved, but he stated that he was unfortunately not in a position to give us any of the names simply because he had not caught any of them when he was introduced to the various officers. He stated that he had never been introduced to UJERRAUFUL by any name and the latter had only been identified as "der Sachbearbeiter". [] went on to explain that since CATIE was involved the case had been coordinated with [] rather than with [] when the need for surveillance and internal security measures arose. [] was brought into the case since [] is not authorized to engage in such activities. [] was introduced to UJERRAUFUL and company in [] office and was only given the barest outline of the case. He later discussed it with [] and learned that the CATIE officers had handled [] on the case in considerable detail.</p>

<p>4. When describing the meeting to us [] stated that [] had asked whether [] could assist in recording the meeting. The [] technician suggested that the double agent be equipped with miniature mike and recorder on his person but GATITE objected to this stating that they did not trust the double agent enough to rely on him to this extent. They made the counter-proposal that [] place a mike somewhere on or near the table. [] eventually agreed to do so but the signal was extremely poor because of the noise from the neighboring tables and the constant clatter of dishes and tableware. The GATITE officers offered the use of some KIMBER audio equipment for the occasion but since it was similar to [], the [] technician preferred to use his own. [] is still working on the tapes and hopes eventually to be able to filter some of the noise out.</p>		
<p>5. When discussing the developments with the GATITE officers, [] stated that he found the case most annoying from the Danish point of view because it forced him to tie up a great deal of [] personnel for surveillance activities during the week-ends when Danes are most reluctant to work. Furthermore, [] did not benefit from it at all and learned nothing from it except getting confirmed that BRANT, HORA and LINSKI were intelligence officers which was sufficiently established already. The GATITE officers apologized for the trouble they were causing [] personnel, but they stated that Copenhagen had apparently been selected as a suitable meeting place and there was little they could do to change it. It thus appears that [] will remain involved in the case for a while whether he likes it or not.</p>		
<p>6. The involvement of [] in the case comes as a surprise to us since he usually always discusses such happenings with us when he drops by our home to have a drink with us. Now that we know that [] is familiar with the case we can, of course, bring it up and extract some additional information from him without too much trouble. Our task in this regard will, however, be greatly facilitated if Wexich Liaison Base will provide us with some additional background information which we can use during our elicitation. We have impressed [] and [] so often with the need for discretion and with the value of the third agency rule that it is difficult for us to ask blunt and direct questions of the type called for in reference, but with a bit of background information we can make our probing more subtle and indirect.</p>
