SUBJECT: Immigration to the United States

1. It is respectfully requested that action be taken on the basis of Attachment A for my immigration to the United States.

- 2. I applied for an immigration visa to the United States through the American consulate general at Naples, Italy, in June 1946. Official notification was given me that I had been registered on 23 September 1946 and had been assigned the Hungarian quota number 202. My wife and children received the German quota numbers 267, 268, 269, and 270.
- 3. Since that time, according to my knowledge, the following action has been taken:
 - a. Our office \(\simes \) made an inquiry on my status at the consulate in Naples sometime in January 1947. As a result, I received the document attached (Attachment B), which apparently I was to fill out and return. Since I was not sure of its purpose, I have not filled it out.

- b. During his stay in Washington, and discussed my problem with our headquarters office and with official authorization presented it to Elmer Davis. From Mr. pavis! office, he received a letter containing Attachment A and stating that no other action was necessary because of the amendments of 24 December 1946.
- 4. I have obtained one affidavit of sponsorship from T and Howard Chapin. Others can be obtained at any time.
- 5. I respectfully petition that quick action may be taken on the visas for me and my family. I should like to go to the United States alone and later bring over my wife and three children, who are now living in Rome, Italy. I have a Hungarian passport, and my wife and the children are on another Hungarian passport. Our present legal residence is Rome.
- 6. Since the amendment of 24 December 1946 enables me also to request a visa for my parents, I expect later to apply for a visa for my father and mother, who are resident in Hungary.
