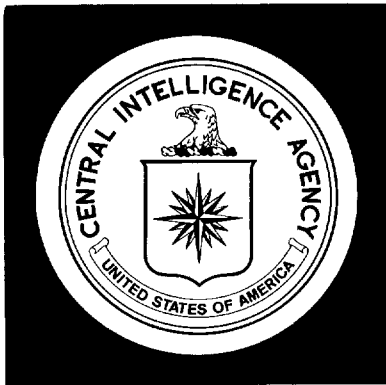


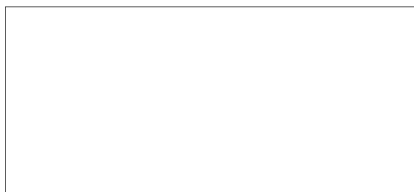

GREECE: Prime Minister Papadopoulos, furious over the continuing student unrest, reportedly is determined to take strong measures, including re-imposing martial law throughout the country, unless order is quickly re-established in the universities.

[redacted] Papadopoulos and several other Greek leaders believe that student unrest is being directed by a group composed of former politicians and cashiered generals. Other high officials are convinced that leftists are stirring up the students. All, however, are concerned that the problem will spill over into other segments of society.

The government's tough line appears aimed at scaring the students into submission and deterring a sympathetic reaction on the part of the public. Some students have already returned to classes, but a vocal minority in Athens University continues to protest. When students at Athens University expressed a desire to hold a rally yesterday, the prime minister angrily ordered the university closed for six days. The government's harsh measures could easily generate greater student defiance. [redacted]
