## MEMORANDUM FOR THE RECORD

SUBJECT: Contacts with E. Howard Hunt

1. The purpose of this memorandum is to state past relationships and contacts I have had with E. Howard Hunt both during the period of his employment with the Agency and after his retirement.

2. I first met Mr. Hunt in 1961 while I was assigned [redacted] I was introduced to him by [redacted] who enjoyed both a professional and social relationship with Mr. Hunt. Shortly thereafter, the [redacted] element to which I was assigned was absorbed into the Domestic Operations Division and Mr. Hunt became my supervisor. I served with DOD from the date of its inauguration until being assigned [redacted] Mr. Hunt was my immediate supervisor during that entire period.

4. Following his retirement, I have encountered Mr. Hunt on two occasions, both times at Blues Alley. The first was at a luncheon in the summer of 1971 which was attended by [redacted]

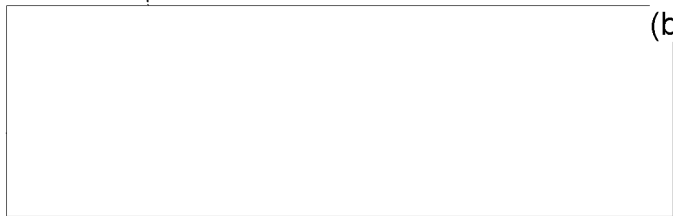
