SUBJECT: COPLON, JUDITH

1. During recent official contact of this office with Mr. and Mrs. [redacted]

[redacted] reported that one Mrs. Mildred KING, Apartment 207, 2316 F Street, Northwest, Washington, D.C. had at one time informed [redacted] that she and Judith COPLON had patronized the same dressmaker. Although the name of the dressmaker was not known, she was identified as a Negro woman residing at 23rd & E Street, Northwest, Washington, D.C.

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2. [redacted] related that Mrs. KING had advised him that COPLON had at times left packages and luggage at this dressmaker's shop. It was further indicated that COPLON apparently rented a room there, where she kept material of unknown significance. It was the opinion of [redacted] that Mrs. KING could, and would furnish this dressmaker's name if contacted, although [redacted] would appreciate his name not being brought into the matter.
