MEMORANDUM FOR: Director of Central Intelligence  
FROM : Deputy Director for Intelligence  
SUBJECT : Hunt Contact with CIA in August 1971

1. This memorandum reports on a contact in August 1971 between Howard Hunt and R. J. Smith, who had been DDI and was between assignments at that time. I am submitting this memorandum not as a report of anything improper but only as a supplement to the record of CIA contacts with Hunt after he left the Agency.

2. Attached is a copy of a note from Hunt to R. J. Smith, dated 3 August 1971, transmitting a resume on a young man, [redacted] who was interested in CIA employment. [redacted] a personnel officer in the DDI, phoned Hunt shortly thereafter to arrange an interview for [redacted] [redacted] was interviewed in Rosslyn, Virginia, on 18 August 1971 by [redacted] of the Office of Personnel. [redacted] was given forms to be completed but he never submitted them to the Agency. The record shows that CIA interest in hiring [redacted] terminated in December 1971.


