Syria/Turkey: Ankara is reacting strongly to the Syrian shelling of Turkish border town Akcakale yesterday that killed five Turkish civilians and wounded at least nine others, the first such incident since the Syrian conflict began. The Turkish military returned fire on Syrian military targets, and several Syrian soldiers were killed. Turkey has resumed shelling this morning. Turkish officials consulted with NATO and the UN yesterday to gain Allied support and the government will seek approval from parliament at a special session this morning to conduct a cross-border incursion,

Top Turkish Government leaders yesterday publicly said that Syria's cross-border shelling was an effort to draw Turkey into Syria and was a violation of international law,

- Meanwhile, Russian Deputy Foreign Minister Gatilov warned NATO against using the incident as a pretext for expanding military involvement in Syria and against introducing initiatives such as humanitarian corridors or buffer zones,
