THE LETTER FROM THE FREE FORCES OF VIETNAM, SIGNED BY LAN, CONGRATULATED THE AMERICANS ON THE 15 OCTOBER MORATORIUM, EXPRESSED CONVICTION THAT THE SUCCESS OF THE MANIFESTATIONS ON 13-16 NOVEMBER WILL BE DOUBLE THAT OF THE 15 OCTOBER EFFORT, AND STATED SOLIDARITY WITH THE AMERICANS IN THEIR EFFORTS TO FORCE FROM THE GOVERNMENT OF THE UNITED STATES A "MORE SINCERE ATTITUDE AT THE PARIS PEACE CONFERENCE AND AN END TO THE WAR IN VIETNAM."

WITHDRAWING SUPPORT FOR THE SAIGON REGIME.
