- In furtherance of investigations of the Projecting Electronic Ray, and in accord with the instructions received in the office of the Director on 20 Dec 50, a second conference was held on Mr. Priest's farm in Hackettstown, New Jersey on 21 Decomber. 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- 5. I must admit that I failed to understand the operational claims for the Projecting Electronic Ray, as outlined by Er. Marchant, and his description of the principle and design details of the equipment. The analysis of these, however, lead me to believe that:

  - b. Neither Mr. Marchant nor any of his associates have shown the basic understanding of the functional capabilities or usefulness of the individual elements of the "projector" as outlined to me by Mr. Marchast.
  - to combine several conventional and well-known electronics principles and equipments in the hope that powerful radiation might result and with expectation that sufficient interest might be produced within the governmental circles to furnish in.   - 6. The examination of the material supplied by Mr. Marchant and obtained by me on a loan basis shows that the basic idea for the Projesting Ray was a subject of a searct contract between Er. Marchant and the United States Army Ordnance issued by the Chief of Ordnance to Marchant and Associates, Inc., in 1936 under Ordnance Contract Word-259. I An inspection of the contract files reveals that the contract was issued on May 9, 1936, and was cancelled on October 8, 1937, due to the failure of Mr. Marchant and his associates to supply the necessary information and services as stipulated by the contract. The matter of the contract and of Mr. Marchant's claims were reviewed by the Chief of Ordnance, U.S. Army, in 1938, upon instigation of Mr. James Hoosevelt and in 1939 as a result of a direct inquiry originated by Semeter H. C. Lodge, Jr. In 1940 the matter was reopened by a proposal of a William P. Mahor to modify the basic ides and equipments for use as an airplane detector capable of 200 miles range. 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- 8. In an attempt to verify my opinion of the basic technical. principles of the Ray producing equipment, and of Mr. Marchant's claims, I discussed the available information and material with ir. Robertson, WCEO, Mr. R. L. Clark and several members of OSL. The results of these discussions were se follows:
  - a. There is no indication that the equipment is capable of meeting any of the claims of Mr. Marchant and his associates.
    - b. There exists no reason for any further action by CIA.
  - e. If the investigations so far made by CIA cannot be terminated, the project should be transferred to the dational Inventors Council for a thorough technical review, inspection, and judgment.

Projecting Electronic Ray

- 1. In accordance with your request, I visited Mr. W. B. Priest on 16 December 1950 at his farm in Hackettstown, N. J. I was accompanied by \_\_\_\_\_\_\_, who handled the preliminary investigations and arrangements for the visit.
- 2. No specific technical information on the Projecting Ray, its principle of operation or its potentialities were made available to me at this meeting, as Mr. A. Marchant, who is claimed to be the originator of the Ray, and who is working on the technical design of the pertinent equipment, was not present.
- 3. The discussions with Mr. Priest and his assistant left me with the following observations and impressions:
  - a. The Projecting Electronic Ray at this stage is a promotional project, the purpose of which is to obtain adequate funds from the U.S. Government for research, development and design of an equipment "capable of delivering powerful electronic energy to a distance in excess of a few hundred yards to cut trees, minerals, and metals, and to destroy life" by conversion of a sharply tuned electronic ray into heat.
  - b. No factual information on technical principles or details of producing the Ray is known to Mr. Priest, and his activities are guided by the potentialities of the Ray as derived from his belief that Mr. Marchant is capable of producing such Ray and from the claimed fact that a prototype of the Ray-producing equipment, as built by Mr. Marchant, was used as a glass and metal cutting tool and was destroyed by Mr. Marchant when he recognized the full significance of the potentialities of the Ray.
  - c. In this promotional project, Mr. Priest has a vested interest derived from his support to the project by the exploitation of his intimate contacts with the high authorities in Washington. The key technical factor is, however, Mr. Marchant. It is apparent that he is reasonably cautious in sharing his ideas on the Electronic Ray, and any attempt to formulate an opinion on the feasibility of production and potentialities of the Ray must involve direct contact with him.

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- 4. A direct contact with Mr. Marchant is predicated on the following conditions, as stipulated by Mr. Marchant and stated to me by Mr. Priest:
  - a. Positive assurances must be given to Mr. Marchant that his ideas and principles, as these pertain to the Electronic Ray, will be duly protected and no attempt to exploit them be made by the government without his concurrence and approval.
  - b. Due credit will be given to Mr. Marchant for his ideas if any use of his ideas and principles are made by the government.
  - c. All negotiation for such uses will be made through the Primalta Research and Development Company.
- 5. Provided that the above conditions are met, Mr. Marchant is anxious to meet with the U.S. Government representatives as soon as feasible, preferably by Wednesday, 20 December 1950.
  - 6. My personal opinion and recommendations are as follows:
  - a. The general pattern of the Projecting Electronic Ray developments so far induces me to think that there is nothing revolutionary in it, and that it is in effect nothing but an outright promotional scheme.
  - b. But for the fact that the President and his personal friend are involved, I would recommend that we drop our participation in the project.
  - c. In view of the manner in which we have been involved in the project, however, I would recommend that the investigations be continued and that a duly authorized representative or representatives of the government be instructed to contact Mr. Marchant.
  - d. In view of the specific requests for assurances contained in paragraph h above, I recommend that the Director's opinion be obtained on the advisability of transferring the responsibility for contacts with Mr. Marchant to RDB or other suitable organizations, or the advisability of requesting participation and support from such organizations to CIA in further investigations.

This report is submitted in response to your informal request to Mr. Osborn of the Contact Division on Friday, 8 December 1950.
- 2. This Office will be happy to take whatever further action you consider desirable to support your report to the DCI on this matter. Based on the limited information we have been able to obtain in the relatively short time allotted, it would appear that Mr. Priest may be the innocent victim of opportunism in the persons of Dr. Gardner and Mr. Marchant.

#### 1. Mr. Marchant

Address, 44 Warren Avenue, Woburn, Massachusetts. Is about 66 years of age and has wife and two daughters. He is waknown in scientific circles in Boston and is not listed in New England roster of professional engineers.

We has a reputation as an eccentric inventor and some years ago the Boston Globe carried a feature article describing his invention of a powerful "death ray". He lives in respectable section of Woburn and is generally thought of as a quiet, stable individual.

#### 2. Mr. Vells Priest

Has lived in the Hackettstown area for over ten years, came from St. Louis, Missouri, where he was reputed to have been a lawyer and a judge of some court there. He is between 60 and 65 years old, married to a former Miss Cox (now 52-53 years old) of Budd Lake, New Jersey. Hence of our informants know of the Primalta Research and Development Company as such, however, his minister knows that he is in the process of organizing a research laboratory and is doing some type of confidential work. There is a Dr. Daniel Gardner working with him but nothing is known about him or his background.

Priest has boasted of his gold mining interests out west (U.S.), has real estate deals around St. Louis and his contacts with high officials in Washington. The minister sew a letter addressed to Priest from President Truman that was of a social nature. Priest claims intimate friendship with General Yangho, Aide to the President. He claims to have been a Vice President of the Third Avenue Transit System in New York City and also to be a relative of Congressman Priest of Tennessee.

He lives on Allamachy Road about one mile putside of Hankettstown in a large (8 to 10 rooms), well kept house, has frequent visitors from New York State, travels to New York City about once a week, appears well off financially, ap-

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parently retired and living on returns from investments, has started several business ventures in Hackettstown area, such as raising chickens, without any apparent success. His neighbor considers him intelligent, a good secure citizen and an emotionally stable individual who has had only minor illnesses during the past ten years. During World Har II, he was a member of the local draft board. None of the three informants had anything adverse to say about Friest and all felt he was a "marmal" individual who was prone to boast a little.

Priest apparently has two associates in his new X Company. Br. Beniel Gardner and a Thomas Brunce, who lives at the Priest's home. Our informants were unable to supply us with details on either Gardner or Brunce.

Records of Port Intelligence Officer, New York Port of Emberhation, dated 20 December 1941, indicate that Priest has ten ID Number 297619 assigned. This is presumed to have been for loyalty check purposes possibly for overseas movement. This communication further classifies Priest as a boiler maker with home address at that date as Mackettstown, New Jersey. No indication of completed investigation appears from records seen. No information is available on Primalta Research and Development Company.

#### 3. Dr. Deniel Gerdner

Born in UEER on March 15, 1875 Professor Metallurgy and Chemistry in St. Petersburg, Russia from 1911 to 1914.

From 1914 to 1925 taught chemistry in London -

University unknown.

1925 to 1940 with Sarbonne in Paris
In 1940 to Colombia, S.A., entered U.S. at various
times, but first entry in 13 May 1944 from Baranquilla, Colombia

Mas written FBI many times on "hot leads" - in 1943 wrote that he was in touch with a Russian by the name of Gabrilowich who had just arrived in this country and who had an invention that could kill mice at 50 yards by death ray.
