SUBJECT: Talk with Howard Osborne, Dir. Security Re: [redacted]

[redacted] Report of Statements made by [redacted]

I talked with Mr. Osborne on 30 May about Mr. [redacted] statements concerning remarks made by Mr. [redacted] at the Advanced Intelligence Seminar No. 6 during the period 3-24 Sept. 1971. Mr. Osborne said that fact that the Office of Security had relations with the local police forces in the Metropolitan Washington Area had been reported to the DCI in the Family Jewel(s) Memo dated 16 May 1973, but that he had no knowledge of the Ballou Case and had not previously heard of any Agency involvement in or connection with the case.

He suggested that I go ahead and talk to Mr. [redacted] and get what facts I could from him, but that he also intended to talk to Mr. [redacted] later himself. He remarked that Mr. [redacted] was a very good briefer, but inclined to be over-expansive at times and talk to much.

4 June 1973

Talked again with Osborne. He had checked on [redacted] story and to see if there was any further involvement by the Agency in the Ballou case. The facts he had obtained correspond with the stories I had got from [redacted] and [redacted] - Mr. Osborne said that the OS relations with the local police and the detail of two OS officers to the Soviet Service for work with a counter subversives at the 1968 Democrat National Convention had been reported to the DCI as items No. 5 and 7 respectively in the "Family Jewels" memo of 16 May 1973.
