# **Tipping Guidelines**

Tipping is not customary except in tourist-oriented restaurants where 10% of the bill is appreciated, but only if a service charge has not already been added. Tour guides and day-long drivers expect \$10-15 (USD) per day for a gratuity. Tip hotel staff \$2-3 (USD) per day for their service .
