The CDC and WHO recommend the following vaccinations for Mongolia: hepatitis A, hepatitis B, typhoid, rabies, tickborne encephalitis, meningitis, polio, measles, mumps and rubella (MMR), Tdap (tetanus, diphtheria and pertussis), chickenpox, shingles, pneumonia, COVID-19, and influenza.

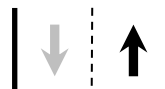

Cultural Practices

Mongolians have a tradition of hospitality, with guests often welcomed into their homes and offered food and drink. Another unique custom is the Mongolian practice of eagle hunting, where trained eagles are used to hunt small game such as foxes and rabbits.

Tipping Guidelines

Tipping 10% in restaurants is customary. It is accepted practice to tip guides and drivers \$10-20 (USD) per person per day.

Souvenirs

Wool, cashmere, and felt goods; leather goods, woodcrafts, batik fabric items

Traditional Cuisine

Khorkhog — meat (usually goat but sometimes mutton) and vegetables cooked inside large milk jugs using hot stones and water

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
